## NW boxing tournament a resounding success

**Mmabatho** – The North West Department of Education and Sport Development in conjunction with Boxing South Africa (BSA) and TK Boxing Promotions hosted the second edition of the North West Boxing tournament on Friday, 27 October at the Mmabatho Convention Centre. The victorious bouts were graced and officially opened by honourable North West premier, Supra Mahumapelo as well as MEC for Education and Sport Development, honourable MEC Sello Lehari. The eight-bout tournament put the province on the map as it drew provincial, national and international boxers to the heart of Mahikeng – with eyes fixated on the provincial title which was a 10-rounder between Tisetso Modisadife of Kanana who bowed out Onke Khanzi of Marikana by Technical Knock-out (TKO) on the second round.

The main bout, which was the chief attraction of the tournament, was the International Boxing Federation (IBF) vacant title flyweight between Moruti Mthalane of KwaZulu-Natal who was defending the SA title against Adrin Diale of Philipine. This bout was 12-round and Mthalane won on Knock-Out (KO) the second round.

### The rest of the scores are as follows:

• Luvelo Vikwa (North West) blew out Bafana Nophondo (Eastern Cape) by TKO on the second round.

- On the junior bantam weight, Sabelo Ngembiyane (Western Cape) outpointed Sibusiso Twani (Eastern Cape) by a TKO on the sixth round.
- Lightweight female international, crowned Ruth Chisale (Malawi) won against Kholosa Ndobayeni (North West) by TKO on round number six.
- Junior light weight international was taken by Koos Sibiya (Gauteng) who won on points against Crispin Molliati (Malawi).
- Michael Mokoena (Gauteng) defended and won the junior welter weight belt by TKO on the tenth round against Gift Bholo (Gauteng).
- Ronald Malindi (Gauteng) took the bantam weight title against Lihle Gingxana (Western Cape) on TKO on the fourth round.

## Dikwena hopes for momentum

**Rustenburg/ Phokeng** – Platinum Stars advanced to the quarterfinals of the Telkom Knockout after defeating Maritzburg United on Friday evening, 27 October, at Harry Gwala stadium. Neither of the sides could fashion a chance to score in 90 minutes, which forced the game into extra time. However, extra-time could not produce a winning goal with both sides lacking the killer instinct in the final third. The match was decided by a penalty shoot-out, after Dikwena and Maritzburg failed to find the back of the net after 120 minutes of football. Where Dikwena goalkeeper Dino Visser was the hero, saving two penalties as they triumphed 3-1 in the shoot-out. Says Stars coach Rodger De Sa: “Ideally, in the position we are in this would have been nice if it was a league win. The worst-case scenario would have been not to win after playing 120 minutes of football, three days before the big game against Ajax Cape Town in the league. But hopefully this brings up some positive feelings in the squad and we can build up, and also play better in the league games.”

Platinum Stars host Bloemfontein Celtics on Saturday in the Telkom Knockout quarterfinals at the Royal Bafokeng Stadium on 4 November; kickoff is at 15h30.
