

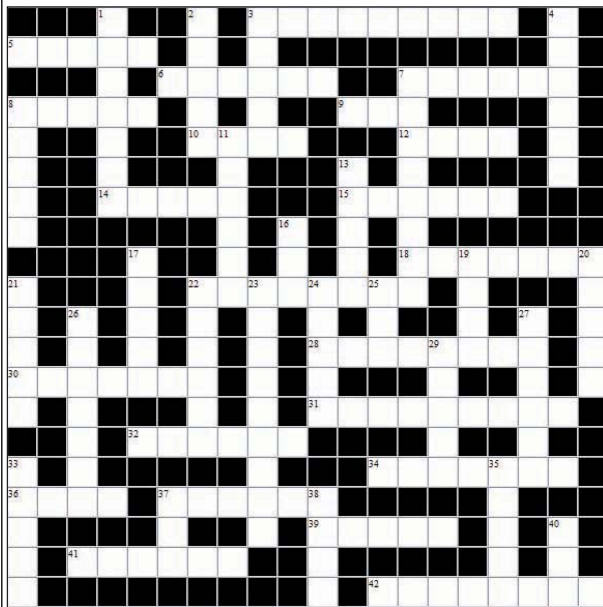
Speed Kills

Consequently, the Toyota and Mitsubishi collided head-on. All involved parties in the Toyota sustained no serious injuries and no one was transported to hospital. The bakkie's 4 occupants sustained light injuries and were treated for shock. The Police is currently investigating the accident.

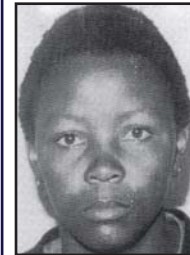
