## Unsolved Car Crash



**Rustenburg** – On Sunday evening, 5 June 2011, approximately 20h15, a male driver of a Mitsubishi Colt lost control over his vehicle, swerved off the road, and rolled a couple of times. The driver was on his way to Rustenburg, when the unexplained occurred. This accident occurred on the old Johannesburg Road, near Vaal Missouri.

In the process, the two occupants of the Colt were slammed out of the vehicle, during which the driver died on scene. The passenger sustained serious injuries and was stabilised on scene before rushed to Ferncrest. **SAPS are currently investigating this accident.**

## 2 Trucks Create Chaos!



**Rustenburg** – On Monday morning, the Platinum Weekly's telephones could not stop ringing... One after the other phoned in to explain the 2-truck and 5-car pile-up that took place the previous day during peak traffic near the Waterfall Mall.

Apparently, Sunday afternoon (5 June 2011), approximately 13h00, a carrier truck loaded with building sand, was travelling down the dangerous downhill on its way to turn left at the robot to travel along the R24, Old Johannesburg Road, direction Rudan Garage. It is suspected that the driver was travelling at a high speed and hit the brakes much too late, which resulted in the truck tipping over. In the process, another truck was hit, and five vehicles piled up, all colliding within seconds.

Luckily no serious injuries were sustained; however, the situation was described as "highly chaotic" by emergency personnel on scene. "It took quite some time to clear the road," reiterated one of the eye witnesses. Trauma Rescue (ER24), Netcare911, the local Fire Department as well as the South African Police Service all worked together to efficiently clear the road as soon as possible.

## Head-on Collision causes Devastation



**Swartruggens** – On Saturday evening, 4 June 2011, approximately 22h15, a horrible car accident occurred somewhat 10 kilometres from Swartruggens on the N4.

There were no eye witnesses on scene to confirm any details, but the Police are currently investigating this case. However, alcohol misuse is speculated – at this stage – as a leading factor to the cause of the accident. Apparently a 1400 Nissan and Toyota Minibus collided head-on. Upon arrival, emergency personnel were met with a horrific scene as both vehicles were crumpled. The driver of the bakkie (only occupant) died on scene. The taxi included eight occupants of which one passenger died. The remaining 7 occupants were all stabilised on scene before rushed to nearby hospitals. Numerous lacerations and abrasions were sustained. Three patients sustained critical injuries with numerous fractures and head injuries.

During the collision, the taxi overturned several times and came to a halt against the bank next to the road. This apparently made the rescue operation tougher as 'Jaws of Life' were used to extract the people from the taxi.
