Voice for the Voiceless



In conjunction with "World No Tobacco Day", Tuesday 31 May 2011, the Cancer Association of South Africa (CANSA), hosted a talk at Meerhofskskool, Hartbeespoort, asking all pupils to help them make a difference in the lives of millions of fellow-South Africans who have no choice but to endure the harmful effects of second-hand smoke. Millions of people have no control over their environment and must endure the deadly effects of tobacco smoke – daily.

"Have you ever thought of the waiters serving tables in the smoking sections of restaurants, domestic workers working in the homes of smokers, prison inmates in cell blocks with poor ventilation, psychiatric facilities where smoking is still very common or even for the rights of unborn

babies whose mothers smoke?" asked Elbe Havemann, CANSA volunteer. "It's time that we speak up and be the voice for the voiceless," said Martha Matsho, CANSA patient care chairperson.

Pupils and teachers wore stickers on Tuesday 31 May 2011 to show their support in the fight against tobacco and the harmful effects of second-hand smoke. James o'Connor, CANSA Brits chairperson and his team sprayed most of the students hair for free. With this act the school showed their solidarity with cancer survivors.

Cancer is one of the most serious diseases people can face, yet there are many more similar situations where tobacco-use is given priority over the health and well-being of others. "Smoking is the main cause of lung cancer – which has one of the lowest survival rates of all cancers. There is good news though. Most of these deaths are preventable by not smoking or giving up smoking in time," adds Annalie Steenkamp Nel, CANSA Community mobiliser.

In South Africa about 23% of adults currently smoke cigarettes, resulting in 125 deaths every day or 44 400 deaths a year. Reducing the incidence of smoking from 23% to 5% in the next three decades is possible but will require an intensification of tobacco control campaigns and education on the harmful effects.

In recognising the urgency of informing South Africans on how to make smart choices, CANSA has made available its eKick Butt programme to help smokers quit the deadly habit and regain their lives. This programme is available as a free download on the CANSA website.
