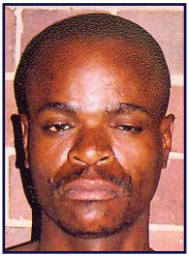

Bike hits Pedestrian



Rustenburg – On Tuesday morning, 14 June 2011, a Honda bike was travelling in the direction of Pretoria (N4) when the unthinkable occurred. Unable to swerve out in time, he hit a pedestrian. This accident occurred in the vicinity of the Stay Easy Hotel (close to the Waterfall Mall). The impact of the collision caused the driver of the motorcycle to skid for about 100 metres before coming to a standstill. According to eyewitnesses, the driver of the bike came down the off-ramp with a very high speed and could not swerve out for the pedestrian in

time to avoid the accident. The driver of the bike sustained injuries to his left arm, possible collarbone fractures as well as numerous bruises. "It looked impossible for him to survive the ordeal," another eye witness said.

The driver was stabilised on scene by emergency personnel before being taken to a nearby hospital. The pedestrian sustained open wounds on his right leg as well as possible head injuries. He was also stabilised on scene before being transported to hospital.

Rustenburg – On the eve of Saturday, 11 June 2011, a Toyota minibus (taxi) allegedly skipped a red light at the robot on the c/o Bosch Street and Oliver Thambo Drive. As a result, the taxi collided with a Volkswagen Polo, who had right of way (green light). This accident occurred approximately 17h30 near Oom Paul School. The Polo was occupied by two women who sustained possible neck- and back injuries.

They were stabilised on scene by emergency personnel before being transported to hospital. The taxi occupied eight passengers who only sustained mild bumps and bruises.
