Rustenburg – “This story is as good as it gets,” commented one of the involved parties, but before I give too much away... Here’s what happened.

On Friday evening, the 17th of June, approximately 21h30, two cars were involved in an accident which resulted in minor injuries of all involved parties. The accident itself is reasonably understandable, but the events leading up to the accident is quite... interesting. Apparently a man with an Opel Corsa had his car fixed up at “friends” and when a “payment disagreement” ensued, the driver allegedly grabbed his keys, slipped into his car and sped away without paying for the services. Moments after

the so-to-say brawl, the mechanics set off chasing the driver of the Corsa. Both vehicles were travelling on the old Pretoria Road, not too far from Rudan Garage, when an accident occurred. Alcohol abuse was supposedly involved; however, the Police are investigating.

The Opel, allegedly on high speed, crashed into a Kia Picanto entering the road from one of the side-roads, resulting in an ugly car accident. The driver of the Corsa sustained only light injuries and he was arrested on scene. The driver of the Kia was mildly hurt; he was stabilised on scene before he was taken to a nearby hospital. Taung – The Police in Pudimoe arrested five suspects, ages ranging from 23 to 57, and in the process they recovered suspected stolen Copper Cable worth R15 000. The incident took place on Wednesday, 22 June 2011 at about 19h30.

It is alleged that the members of the community spotted a suspicious looking vehicle (bakkie) that was parked along the road near Sedibeng Water Reservoir. Two police members who were on duty responded swiftly to the community call and when they confronted the suspects and searched their vehicle, the police found a rolled copper cable, a Crowbar, Bar saw, Bolt cutter and two live ammunition (9mm bullets) were also found in their possession. Thumile Sankofi and his co-accused are believed to be from Fochville and Schweizer-Reneke. They appeared briefly before the Taung Magistrate’s Court on a charge of possession of suspected stolen Property. Their bail application will be heard on the 30th June 2011.
