When Trucks & Cars Collide



Rustenburg – A Ford Escort and a carrier truck collided on the old Johannesburg Road (R24) on Tuesday evening, approximately 20h30.

The female driver of the Ford was on her way to Rustenburg, and the truck was travelling direction Johannesburg. According to the driver of the Ford, "The truck

Waste Compactor Trucks worth R8m for Rustenburg!

Rustenburg – The Rustenburg Local Municipality has handed over Waste Management trucks worth not less than R8 million (Tuesday, 28 June 2011) to the community of Rustenburg.

The procured trucks are highly durable with fitted bin lifting mechanisms and an automatic gear lever to ensure that the trucks can handle the dynamic landscape of the Rustenburg Local Municipal area.

The primary objective of procuring the 4 Waste Compactor Trucks is to integrate, improve and optimise waste management services, in order to maximise efficiency by providing an adequate service to residents and businesses in the Rustenburg area. This, in return will minimise the associated environmental impacts and financial costs to improve quality of life.

A sustainable Integrated Waste Management Plan will require changes in the way waste management is handled in Rustenburg. Therefore, this supply of new trucks will reduce the backlog and delays in service delivery due to old and obsolete trucks.



30 Illegal Shacks Demolished



Rustenburg – About 100 Boitekong residents were evicted after an illegal land-grab during the weekend of 25 June 2011. Nearly 30 shacks were demolished during a 3-hour raid on council land across the road from neighbouring RDP settlements.

Close to five hundred "sites" were also put into place. They were also demolished during the raid. At least 8 vehicles were impounded by the municipal

traffic personnel after they were found illegally parked close to the illegally occupied land.

The owners have since paid the R300 fines at the traffic offices. The local sheriff of the court warned the "land grabbers" not to continue with their actions over the weekend – but was ignored.
