Don't Drink & Drive!

Rustenburg – A man learnt the hard way that drinking and driving does not pay when the VW Golf he was driving overturned after he allegedly lost control on a downhill stretch along the Helen Joseph Drive [turning into Waterberg]. The accident occurred on Friday, August 5 at around 20h30 on the downhill stretch of the mountain at the side of the Waterfall Mall.

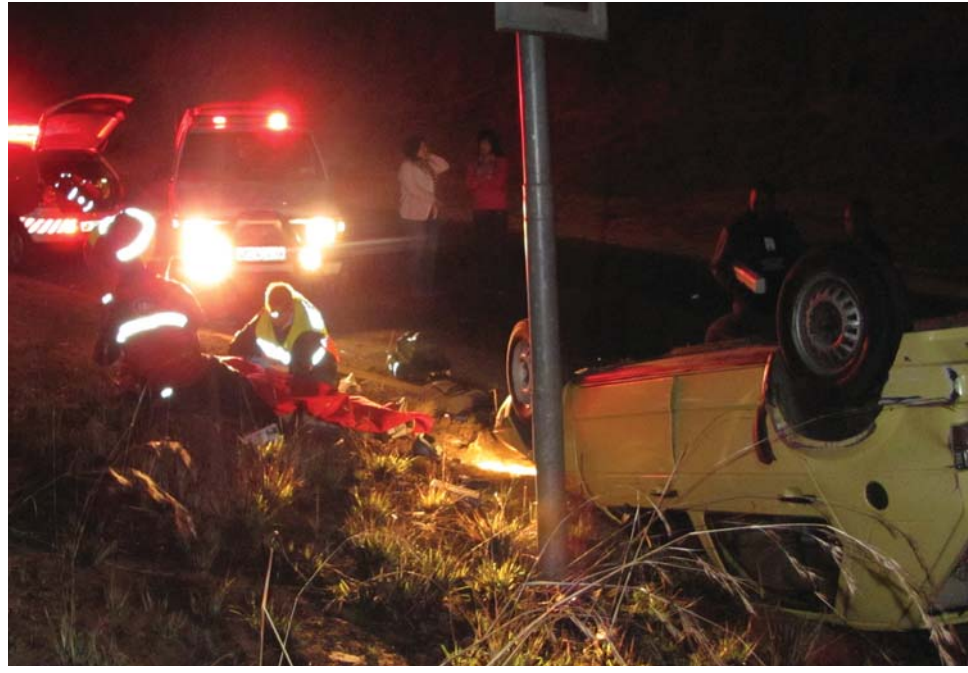
Eyewitnesses say the driver, who was lucky to sustain minor injuries, was prob-

ably driving under the influence of alcohol as his vehicle first veered to the left and returned to its lane before overturning.

"He was travelling at high speed and I think he had consumed alcohol," said an eyewitness.

The driver was taken to the Job Shimankana Tabane Hospital after he was treated for shock by paramedics at the scene of the accident.

SAPS are still investigating the case.



Beating the Bends

Rustenburg – A holiday for two people from Pretoria turned nasty when the vehicle they were travelling in was involved in an accident on Friday, August 5 on the N4, at the first Koster Road turn-off from Rustenburg's direction. The accident occurred at around 19h 45.

According to eyewitnesses, the driver of the Nissan Almera was travelling downwards from the mountain with the intention of turning left at the Koster turn-off, but instead took the bend too wide while trying to negotiate the corner.

This resulted in a head-on collision with a

Fiat bakkie at the stop sign of the Koster turn-off.

The two vehicles collided after which the Nissan span out of control and came to a halt next to the road in bushes.

Both the occupants in the Fiat sustained no injuries while the two women in the Nissan were transported to respectively the Job Shimankana Tabane Hospital as well as the Peglerae Hospital for observation and treatment. They sustained lacerations and abrasions.

SAPS are carrying out further investigations.



13 Survive Horror Crash

Rustenburg/Sun City – Thirteen survived an accident involving four vehicles, which occurred about 35km from Rustenburg, on the road between Maja-kaneng and Sun City on Saturday 6 August, 2011 at around 22h15.

According to eyewitnesses, the accident was caused by the driver of a white Toyota Twincam, who says he swerved from his lane to avoid donkeys on the road.

"The driver later said cattle (and not donkeys) were crossing the road at the time of the accident," said the eyewitness. Animals are known to cross this road frequently, but when paramedics arrived on scene, there was no sign of any animals. When the Toyota Twincam veered from its lane, his vehicle collided with a Toyota Sedan, which crashed into a Toyota Corolla and a Volkswagen Passat. The driver of the Toyota Twincam was apparently on his way to Sun City.

Luckily, no one was seriously injured. Eleven of the people sustained mere bumps and bruises, lacerations and abrasions; while two people were taken to Ferncrest and Job Shimankane Tabane Hospitals for observation.

SAPS are investigating a case of negligent driving.
