## 'Blessed is the hand that gives'



**Rustenburg** – A Chinese supermarket based in Rustenburg has donated groceries to about 120 people living in an informal settlement located a few kilometres from the R510 Thabazimbi Road, behind the Ramochana Correctional Services Centre. This initiative was led by Pastor Edwin Khunou of the Father's Love Ministries Church.

On Wednesday 10 August, Cheapest Supermarket and Wholesalers – led by owner Qing Qiang – paid a visit to poor people living at the settlement as part of efforts geared towards giving back to the community. "It is important that we also give back, because we are making profits from doing business here in Rustenburg. Other people should also benefit

from our work and it is up to us to contribute towards this," said Mr. Qiang. Delivering a message of hope to the people living within the settlement, Pastor Khunou encouraged the community members to adopt a positive outlook in life by focusing on what they have. "You might say that you are hungry, with no food or employment, but there is someone else without an arm or a leg," he said.

The grocery packs included basic items such as sugar, cooking oil, soap, maize meal and tinned foods. Most of the recipients, who have been residing in the area for more than three years, say they were forced to make the settlement their home due to a number of reasons ranging from domestic problems to failure of securing permanent employment.
