## IMPORTANT INFO!!!

### Medical Aid Details

Most private medical facilities do not accept patients if they don't have a medical aid. In the unfortunate case of a medical emergency, valuable time is saved if your medical aid details are readily available. It is therefore important that when you travel your family's medical aid details are easily accessible to anyone.

Also important: You MUST at ALL times have contact numbers of your friends and family in your vehicle, or at least some form of identification. In distressing

circumstances e.g. an accident, emergency personnel will not know who to contact if no information is available.

### Packing Your First Aid Kit

Your travelling first aid kit is a comfort box and an emergency kit in one. It needs to be stocked with everyday medication as well as the items needed to treat minor injuries. One should always make sure that any personal, special medication such as insulin is suitably packed and ready to go along with you. **Phone Trauma Rescue at 0861 789 911 to order one.**

## Driver loses control, car rolls



## Pedestrian knocked over...



**Rustenburg** – A pedestrian sustained serious injuries after he was knocked over by a vehicle in an accident which occurred in Rustenburg North on September 16 at around 12h30.

The cause of the accident is not yet known and police are still investigating the case in order to establish further details. The pedestrian – who sustained C-spine (back of the neck) injuries and a slight back injury – was taken to the Job Shimankana Tabane Hospital and is now in a stable condition. The male driver of the Ford Bantam bakkie was not hurt.

**Rustenburg** – A Toyota Corolla rolled several times after its driver lost control over the vehicle in an accident that occurred on September 16 at around 06h30 on the old Johannesburg Road. According to eyewitnesses, the driver is believed to have been driving under the influence of alcohol. The accident occurred about 50km from Rustenburg.

“All three people who were in the vehicle were taken to the Job Shimankana Tabane Hospital to be treated for minor injuries,” said an eyewitness. The occupants are believed to be in their 20s and 30s.

## Pothole causes disaster



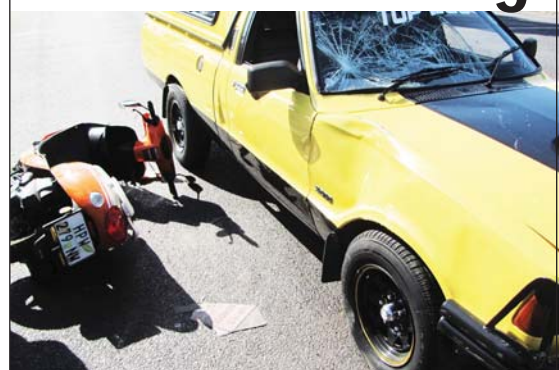
**Rustenburg** – A pothole along the old Johannesburg Road was the alleged cause of an accident that occurred on September 17 at around 12h00.

According to information gathered, the driver failed to control the vehicle after hitting a pothole. The car rolled several times and the five occupants had to be

rushed to hospital for treatment.

One of the people from the car was taken to the Peglerae Hospital after sustaining a neck injury while the others were transported to the Job Shimankana Tabane Hospital to be treated for minor injuries.

## Crash Boom Bang!



**Rustenburg** – Two people travelling on a scooter-motorbike were injured after they collided with a vehicle, which allegedly skipped a red light. The accident occurred along the Oliver Tambo Drive on September 17 at around 3h10.

According to eyewitnesses, the driver of the vehicle skipped a red traffic light and the motorbike rammed into the Ford Bakkie. “The man on the scooter sustained leg- and some head injuries while the woman broke her leg,” said one of the eyewitnesses. Both of them were taken to the Job Shimankana Tabane Hospital for treatment. SAPS are carrying out further investigations.
