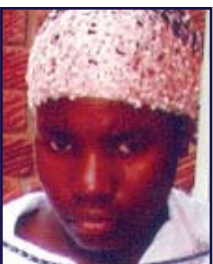

A TIP for all Drivers... It can save a life.



Motorists often take emergency vehicles/ ambulances for granted on the road. As a driver, you are bound by the law to give priority to emergency vehicles – even if you have the right of way! In emergency situations, time is very important and can mean the difference between life and death – especially during the golden hour (your 1st hour after an accident/ emergency situation). So as a driver, please give way to emergency vehicles and do not obstruct them at the traffic lights. Emergency vehicles can be easily identified through their flashing

lights and loud sirens. Vehicles should also not tail them. Also of importance: Motorists and passengers are advised to keep their personal information, regarding identity documents, medical cards/bracelets, and contact information of family, on them at all times in case they are involved in an accident. Information related to allergies or the person to contact when one is involved is very crucial and, at times, can mean the difference between life and death!

Drunk Driver Arrested



Rustenburg – A driver, believed to have been under the influence of alcohol, was promptly arrested by police after causing an accident that left a child injured. The accident took place on October 13 at 21h00 in Oliver Tambo drive, Rustenburg. According to eyewitnesses, the arrested driver of the blue Nissan lost control of his vehicle, and hit a stationary black Chevrolet, in a parking lot next to the road.

The driver of the Nissan had one passenger – a child, according to reports - not wearing a safety belt, who was also the only injured person during this ordeal.

The child, approximately 6 years old, was taken to Peglerae Hospital while police immediately opened a case of negligent driving and driving under the influence of alcohol. SAPS are carrying out further investigations.

Miraculous escape...



Rustenburg – “They are lucky to be alive,” said an eye witnesses in response to a horrible head-on collision on the N4 Highway, about 5km from the Marikana Tollgate. The accident occurred on October 15 at around 23h00. While the cause of the accident is yet to be established, it is believed that the driver of the white Toyota Hilux bakkie, which collided with the white Mercedes Benz, was allegedly driving under the influence of alcohol. Emergency personnel was met with a disastrous scene – the Mercedes on its roof, and the bakkie a few metres away, in a field next to the road. Jaws of Life, via the assistance of the Rustenburg Fire Department, had to be used to cut the vehicle to free the driver

of the bakkie. His injuries included a broken arm. The three children and two adults travelling in the Mercedes only sustained minor injuries. The SAPS is investigating.

Accident leaves unanswered questions



Rustenburg – Police are yet to establish the circumstances leading to an accident that resulted in a red, double-cab bakkie overturning on the Thabazimi Road (direction Thabazimbi). No other vehicles were involved in the accident. The accident – which occurred on 15 October at around 15h15 about 50km from Rustenburg – saw

all four occupants of the vehicle being rushed to Peglerae Hospital after sustaining spinal-, back- and chest injuries as well as various lacerations. Fortunately, none of the occupants passed away. The Police are still in the process of establishing more facts related to the accident.

4 ambulances, 16 victims



Rustenburg – A total of 16 people had to be rushed to hospital after a taxi overturned while travelling on the Lyndsleyspoort Road on 15 October 2011 (approximately 15h15). The accident occurred about 50km from Rustenburg and police are still trying to establish more facts related to the accident.

The patients travelling in the white Toyota Minibus sustained lacerations, spine-, chest- and shoulder injuries. Four ambulances were called out to transport the victims to various clinics and hospitals. The condition of the road that the taxi was travelling on is very bad and police are exploring the possibility that the accident could have been caused by a pothole.
