13-year old raped 2x Rape incidents in Protea Park, Rustenburg

REAL MEN DON'T
RAPE!

Rustenburg – Tragedy struck Rustenburg with two rape cases reported to the Rustenburg Police. Both took place during broad daylight.

In the first case, a 13-year old girl was walking home past the Wildey Shopping Complex in Protea Park on Saturday afternoon, 21 January 2017 at approximately 14h30. The minor's home was just a couple of street blocks away.

According to Captain Elsabé Augoustides, police spokesperson, the girl was preoccupied with her cell phone and never realised she was being followed by two unknown African males.

When one of the perpetrators grabbed her from behind, her first thought was that someone was making a joke. Soon she realised the two men wanted to harm her.

"The 13-year old girl fainted when one of the suspects started to strangle her. He also covered her mouth preventing her from screaming for help," Captain Augoustides said. "The suspect threw her to the ground while the second suspect started to undress her on the pavement between the residential houses and then he continued to rape her." The minor's cell phone was stolen after the horrendous attack. The traumatized child could not give a clear indication as to whether or not both of the perpetrators

raped her. After the ordeal, she was utterly shocked and screamed for help. Her mother heard her screaming and came running.

The child collapsed in front of her house. Neighbours came running and tried to help find the attackers, but they had already fled the scene.

"In another incident, a 54-year old female was walking towards the Safari Spar, when she was also grabbed by two men, and raped in more or less the same area a few days earlier," Captain Augoustides said.

The Police are appealing to residents of the Protea Park and immediate vicinity to be extremely cautious and to warn their children. Teenagers and women should be on high alert and should shout as loud as they can in a distress situation.

They are described as two young African males, in their twenties. One suspect was wearing a navy blue hat with brown leather tokens dangling from the hat.

The second suspect was wearing a yellow t-shirt. At this stage, it cannot be confirmed that the same two men are to blame for the rape incidents.

The Police are investigating both incidents. If anyone has any information please come forward or contact your closest Police station.

Robbed at gun-point, Selly Park

Rustenburg – On Friday afternoon, 20 January 2017 at approximately 13h30, a woman parked her vehicle, a golden-coloured Range Rover Sport, next to the gate of the parents' parking lot of Selly Park Convent school.

She slipped into the ladies room when, out of the blue, an African male wearing a balaclava held her at gunpoint.

"The suspect warned the woman to cooperate with him," Captain Elsabé Augoustides, police spokesperson, said. She was robbed of her designer wrist watch, silver wedding band, I-phone and car keys.

The man fled the scene and got into a silver BMW (registration plates: JMP 669 NW). There was other occupants in the getaway vehicles, with one waiting outside the car. Once his fellow-accomplice emerged from the ladies room, he grabbed the stolen keys and sped off with the woman's Range Rover.

A motor vehicle theft and armed robbery case was opened and the Police are investigating. The value of the vehicle and stolen items are estimated at R1.4 million.

Lodges & Guest Houses BEWARE Rustenburg: Increase in Burglaries and Business Robberies

Rustenburg – "We are concerned about the spate of burglaries and business robbers, especially at Lodges and Guest Houses around Rustenburg," Captain Elsabé Augoustides, police spokesperson, warned this week.

The following areas have been targets; Rhenosterfontein (Country Estate), Boschfontein (Monyati Inn), Waterglen (Oude Landgoed Lodge), Olifantshoek (Balule Bush Lodge) and Modderfontein (Bietjie Berg).

"We request that guest lodges inform their security on the premises to be vigilant and to report any suspicious behaviour to the Police on 014-590 4115/6/7," Captain Augoustides said.



3-year old and mother held at gunpoint, robbery

Rustenburg – On Sunday, 22 January 2017 at approximately 02h15, a woman residing in Hex River Village, Waterkloof, woke up to the sound of dogs barking and what sounded like a gunshot, Captain Elsabé Augoustides, police spokesperson, said.

When she got up, she was faced by two attackers in her home as they forced their way through the front door. "They demanded cash, upon which the woman explained she had none," Captain Augoustides said.

The woman fled to her 3-year old's bedroom, still fast asleep, and held her in her arms as a means of protecting her little girl.

While under gunpoint, the assailants robbed the woman of a JCV TV and I-Phone.

No arrests have been made thus far and Police investigations continue. The suspects fled on foot. One of the dogs were wounded by the perpetrators.

"We appeal to residents in the complex to be vigilant," Captain Augoustides urged.

Robbery at school in Geelhout Park

Rustenburg – The Kloofview Primary School in Manuka street, Geelhout Park, was robbed over the weekend.

"According to the school teachers and personnel, the doors and windows were locked when they left for the day on Friday, 20 January 2017, and as always, the alarm was activated," Captain Elsabé Augoustides, police spokesperson, said. "On Sunday morning, 22 January at about 08h30, the principal reported that the school was burgled."

The suspects gained access through the

roof of the administration block. A safe was grinded open and the alarm cables were cut. A number of laptops, tablets, computers, a cheque book, a digital camera, keys and cash were stolen, all to the estimated value of R705 000,00.

A case of business burglary has been opened and the Police are investigating. **Schools are requested to tighten their security after hours and especially over weekends. Any person with information is requested to contact Lt Col Pule directly on 082-773 0047.**
