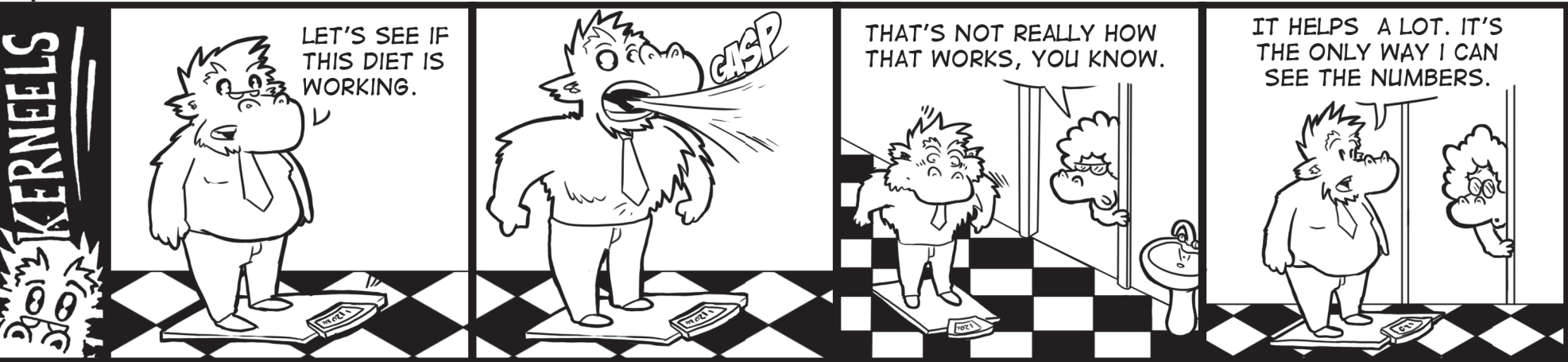




Break down turned robbery

Brits – A young family traveling past Brits recently escaped with their lives after their

vehicle broke down on the N4. Brits communications officer Talane said the incident occurred on Sunday 4 March at about 22h15. A man traveling with his children had a breakdown on the highway and as they were trying to fix the vehicle, two armed men approached them. They held the man and his children at gunpoint and ordered them into the bushes

next to the road. While the family was in the bushes, away from the vehicle, the two gunmen searched through their vehicle and took off with cell phones and other possessions. No one was injured during the incident, but police are currently investigating a case of robbery. **Anyone with information regarding this**

COPPER CABLE BUST

Rustenburg – Two copper cable thieves arrested a week ago, appeared before the Rustenburg Magistrates' Court and were remanded in police custody. "The pair, Monde Zimase and Daniel Baloyi, was part of a group of four who were found in possession of 138.6kg copper cables on 8 March," said sergeant Ofentse Mokgadi, police spokesperson. Two of their accomplices escaped and are still on the run. Their arrest followed a complaint that copper cables were being stolen at the Mega Logistics Station in the Rustenburg Industrial area. The Rustenburg South African Police Station (SAPS) cluster commander general Arthur Adams showered the members of the K9 unit with praises for a job well done.

Crash claims two young lives

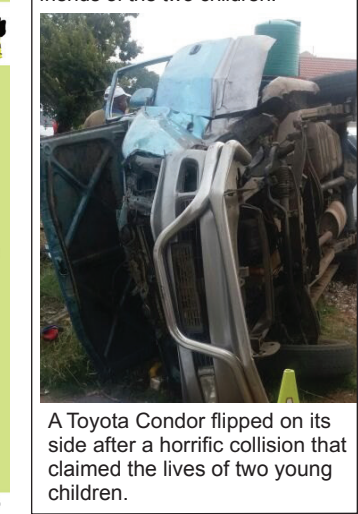
Rustenburg – Two children died when two vehicles collided in the early hours of Tuesday morning, 13 March, in Rustenburg North. According to captain Elsabé Augoustides, police spokesperson, the two children, a 2-year old girl and a 7-year old boy were declared dead on scene. The two children were part of a group of 13 children travelling in a Condor driven by a 40-year old female. They were on their way to Rustenburg North Primary School. When emergency services arrived on the scene, the children were still

trapped inside the Condor which had flipped on its side due to the impact of the collision. The driver of the second vehicle, a white Hyundai Sedan, sustained injuries and is recuperating in hospital. The driver of the Condor, and the remaining eleven children who survived the accident, suffered various injuries and were taken to different hospitals in the area. A culpable homicide case is being investigated. The mayor of Rustenburg, councillor Mpho Khunou accompanied by ward councillors, on the afternoon of the accident, visited the bereaved families of the deceased to deliver a message of hope and comfort. We extend our sincerest condolences to the families and friends of the two children.
