
# Tragic loss of deputy sheriff

## Rustenburg job cuts going ahead

Rustenburg - Implats's strategic transformation initiative is going ahead. In an Implats press release on 2 August 2018, the Board of Directors of Implats approved the next phase of the implementation of Impala Rustenburg's strategic transformation.

Restructuring will be implemented over a twoyear period:

- Moving from 11 to six operating shafts: reducing future production from 750,000 platinum ounces per annum to 520,000.
- Reducing the all-in unit cost from R29 016 per platinum ounce estimated for FY2018, to

2018 real terms).

Reducing the labour complement (employees plus contractors) from approximately 40,000 at the end of FY2018, to 27,000 over the two-year implementation period.

Implats chief executive officer Nico Muller said: 'The only option for conventional producers today is to fundamentally restructure lossmaking operations to address cash-burn and create lower-cost, profitable businesses that are able to sustain operations and employment

in a lower metal price
