Interestingly, the number of records of sightings has increased over the past decade. This migratory specialist has gone from a species that was recorded only 20 times during the 1980s to over 300 times in the 2016/2017 season.

Caroline grew up in Maine in the United States of America where she started birding at an early age. After graduating, she moved to South Africa and started a MSc at the University of the Witwatersrand. Her MSc modelled habitat selection and power line risk in Cape and White-backed Vultures in South Africa. In addition to her PhD, she assists with social media at BirdLife South Africa and 'Ostrich', the journal of African Ornithology. In her time in southern Africa, she has birded all over the sub-region picking up 747 bird species.

On Saturday 26 January, BirdLife Rustenburg will take part in the mid-summer coordinated waterbird counts (CWAC) at Rockwall and Olifantsnek Dams.
