APPLICATION FOR POSTPONEMENT OF THE NATIONAL ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT: AIR QUALITY ACT NO. 39 OF 2004 - MINIMUM EMISSIONS STANDARDS, FOR ANGLO AMERICAN PLATINUM'S WATERVAL SMELTER COMPLEX LOCATED IN RUSTENBURG, NORTH WEST PROVINCE, JANUARY 2019 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PROCESS: INVITATION TO REGISTER AND COMMENT

Anglo American Platinum's (AAP) subsidiary, Rustenburg Platinum Mines Limited (RPM), owns and operates the Waterval Smelter Complex, located in the Rustenburg town in the Bojanala District Municipality in the North West Province. The Waterval Smelter Complex holds an Atmospheric Emissions Licence (AEL) and is required to comply with the Minimum Emission Standards (MES) published in terms of Section 21 of the National Environment Management: Air Quality Act, No. 39 of 2004 (NEM:AQA).

Waterval Smelter Complex is working toward compliance with the "New Plant" MES, effective on 1 April 2020, and is in the process of investigating abatement options to mitigate Sulphur Dioxide (SO₂) emissions to comply with the New Plant MES. This investigation is necessary as it evaluates the emission impact of the AAP, Bafokeng Rasimone Platinum Mine (located near Rustenburg) and Mogalakwena Mine concentrates (located near Mokopane), both of which have a high sulphur content, to be processed at the Waterval Smelter Complex. In addition, it is necessary for AAP to evaluate the impact of potential start/stop activities at the Acid Plant on the 2020 MES limits.

The abatement options are expected to be completed and fully ramped up by December 2023, consequently, RPM wishes to apply for postponement, until end of December 2023, of the New Plant MES (Postponement Application), whilst it considers the outcome of the investigation and evaluation referred to above as well as the installation of appropriate abatement technology.

Airshed Planning Professionals (Pty) Ltd, an independent consulting firm of air quality specialists, has been appointed by RPM to compile the Atmospheric Impact Report (AIR) report in support of the MES Postponement Application.

SLR Consulting (South Africa) (Pty) Ltd (SLR), an independent environmental consulting firm, has been appointed by Airshed to undertake the public participation process in support of the 2020 Postponement Application. The public participation process is being undertaken in terms of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998): Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations (GNR 982, 4 December 2014), as amended.
