ROAD UPGRADES TO BOOST RUSTENBURG ECONOMY

Rustenburg – Road construction projects by the South African National Roads Agency Ltd (SANRAL), to the tune of R625 million, are set to enhance the economy of Rustenburg and surrounding communities.

Speaking during a stakeholder engagement session held in Rustenburg on Friday 24 May, SANRAL board chairman Themba Mhambi said the projects, which include the improvement of the R52 from Rustenburg to Koster, are still in the early stages of design.

The session was held to address the concerns of municipalities as well as to inform other stakeholders about the opportunities that are likely to be unlocked by projects of this magnitude.

"It is our intention that small enterprises, people with disabilities and military veterans will also take part in our projects, especially our routine road maintenance and community development work packages," Themba said.

SANRAL Northern region manager Progress Hlahla revealed that the company currently manages around 2,598km of roads in the North West and continues to play a considerable role on infrastructure development in the province. He explained that for the next 10 years, SANRAL has set a target to complete 85 construction projects. The projects include the upgrade of the N4 as well as the resurfacing of the R505 from Wolmaransstad to the N14.

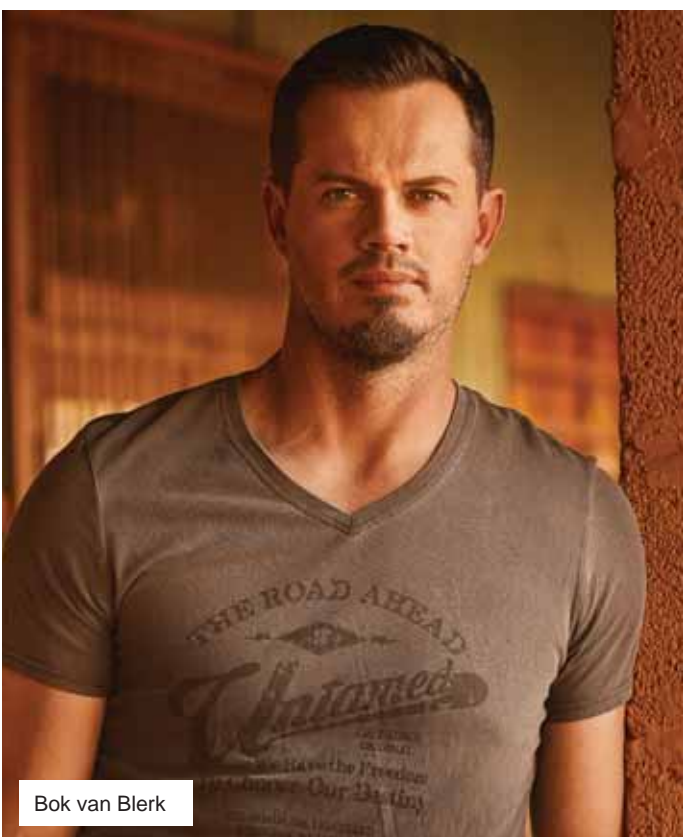
