

# SA FUEL RELIEF, 91 CENTS PER LITRE DECREASE



Retreating oil prices have painted a rosier picture for South African fuel users, than has been the case for much of 2019. This is according to the unaudited mid-month fuel price data released by the Central Energy Fund.

At this stage, we predict a decrease of 91 cents/ litre to the petrol, 70 cents to the diesel price, and 62 cents to illuminating paraffin.

The story of the month is definitely oil. Crude laboured above \$70 a barrel for large portions of April and May, as the tug-of-war continued between the OPEC countries, which favour ongoing output restrictions, and the USA, where production is forging ahead.

There had been a remarkable drop in the price of oil since the end of May, with the commodity currently trading around \$61 dollars a barrel.

South Africans are not getting full value though, thanks to Rand jitters in the wake of the ANC top leadership trading jibes over the future of the Reserve Bank. After a period of sustained price stability, the Rand weakened substantially against the US dollar, taking some of the shine off oil's retreat.

The expected price drops are nonetheless substantial, with petrol showing a 91 cent-alitre drop at month end, with reductions of 70 cents and 62 cents respectively for diesel and illuminating paraffin.

If stability returns to the Rand and oil settles at its lower level, there might yet be more good news in the pipeline.



# MAN NABBED FOR 117KG OF COPPER

Rustenburg – A 36-year old man was arrested by the Rustenburg Police on Tuesday 12 June after failing to produce papers for thousands of Rands worth of copper cables found in his possession, and is set to be tried by the Rustenburg Magistrates' Court. The man was nabbed in Sondela during a police raid to establish if those dealing in scrap metal, second-hand goods, motor vehicles, tyres and cellular phones were conducting their businesses within the confines of the law. Police spokesperson sergeant Ofentse Mokgadi said the raid focused on dealers operating in Tlhabane, Boitekong and surrounding areas.

"The man was arrested for the illegal possession of 117kg of copper cables after he failed to produce the necessary documentation," Ofentse said. The police also suspect that two valves found in the man's possession and could not be accounted for, could be the property of a local mining company.

"Several fines were issued to cell phone dealers who failed to comply with the law," Ofentse added.
