"Our aim is to widen the participation net to

assist the business in delivering complete local sourcing of barley. To that end, we have already committed a significant investment of more than R2,8 million in 2018 alone, in order to support our participating commercial farming partners with interest-free loans," added Vogt. a huge success, as 97% of farmers that were trained and mentored, were able to meet the specifications needed for malting barley. The barley yields were also good, as all farmers that planted could repay their loans within a year period.
