**Rustenburg** – The executive mayor of Rustenburg Local Municipality (RLM) councillor Mpho Khunou joined the masses of Rustenburg residents, who came out in numbers despite the chilly winter's morning of Friday 28 June to be part of the #Y4R (Youth for Rustenburg) annual games held at Olympia Park Stadium. The #Y4R was a month-long programme spearheaded by RLM to intensify the engagement between the youth of Rustenburg and the municipality to bring about the desired socio-economic shift. The programme, which kicked off three weeks ago, laid the foundation for the month's festivities which created dialogue and engagement with leaders from government and businesses. Mayor Khunou said: “If we fail to acknowledge the youth, it means there is no future for this country. We are obliged to provide support to the youth.
