## SPRING SCHOOL CAMP

As part of our SLP, Sibanye-Stillwater partnered with the North West Department of Education and Sports Development to develop a one week spring school camp, for Grade 12 learners from 10 high schools in and around Rustenburg.

The purpose of the camp was to prepare Grade 12 learners for their final year examinations and equip them with information they struggled to grasp in class lessons. The aim of this camp was to improve the participating schools' pass rate and boost the provincial pass rate.





The camp focused on Mathematics and Physical Science. Other subjects that were included were Geography, Accounting, Life Sciences, Business Studies and Economics. All 569 learners participated in the camp.

## MFIDIKWE WATERBORNE SEWER

Mfidikoe Waterborne Sewer is implemented as a partnership project between Sibanye-Stillwater and the Rustenburg Community Development Trust in Mfidikoe.

The project will improve services for 2 466 community members of Ward 64. This project entails the installation of waterborne sanitation infrastructure in line with national standards.

The project has thus far created 45 temporary jobs and is anticipated to be completed in 2020.





## PEOPLE FIRST PIGGERY

Boitekong Piggery trading as People First Piggery, is a registered cooperative comprising of five women and two men. Our support is to develop the infrastructure to ensure that the cooperative can have a breeding facility, and this will enable them to be sustainable since they won't be buying wieners (piglets) from commercial piggery farmers but breeding on their own, and this will reduce costs on the part of the cooperative.







## MFIDIKOE CLINIC

Mfidikoe Clinic offers health services to the Mfidikoe Community, Thekwane Village and Zakhele Informal Settlement. The Department of Health identified the need to expand the clinic to better assist the community and approached Sibanye-Stillwater to assist with the expansion.

The project includes the expansion of the medication storage facility to the specifications of the health department as well as the installation of a medical refrigerator.

Construction has commenced and the project is scheduled to be completed in October 2019 and will create 20 temporary jobs for Ward 64 community members.
