ECD PRACTITIONERS BASIC FIRST AID TRAINING

A two-day NQF Level 1 First Aid procedure and basic life support workshop for 15 ECD practitioners took place in February 2019.

The workshop focused on the following aspects of first aid:

- Emergency scene management
- First aid procedures
- Treatment of common injuries
- Contents of the first aid kits
- Emergency rules
- Assessing the emergency scene and
- Elementary anatomy and physiology.



This training was done in collaboration with MINOPEX, who gave participants first aid kits.

SCHOLAR PATROL

DONATION OF PRIMARY HEALTH CARE MOBILE UNITS

Two fully equipped maternal and obstetric ambulances were donated to the Department of Health in the North West.

The ambulances currently benefit 2,000 community members in six communities around Phokeng and Tlhabane Health Centre.

The R1,5 million project is aimed at reducing maternal mortality in the region.

In addition, two mobile clinics were donated to provide services to areas around the mine where there are no clinics.



PLANNED PROJECTS FOR 2019 - 2020

► Construction of a Walkway Bridge

The Construction of a Walkway Bridge between Sunrise Park and Popo Molefe settlement is a development that will address major challenges in the two areas. Popo Molefe is a challenged settlement with no basic amenities such as sanitation, potable water supply, roads and electricity.

The project objective is to create a safe river crossing point for the community of Ward 22 thus reducing possible drownings during rainy seasons.

► Thekwana Poultry Project

Thekwane Poultry Project is located at Thekwana Village. This is one of the Royal Bafokeng villages. The beneficiaries consist of males and females from Thekwana, where the project is formally registered as Kgatontle Farming and Projects Primary Co-operative. Sibanye-Stillwater's involvement and objective is to resuscitate the business by reconstructing the vandalised infrastructure. The support will also include assistance with business and technical skills training for the beneficiaries

► High Mast Lights

The Rustenburg Local Municipality and Royal Bafokeng Administration communities have been requesting assistance with the installation of high mast lights. Sibanye-Stillwater saw the value in funding this project as the lights will improve the standards of living for the communities.

The installation of the 47 high mast lights will cover the following areas:

- Nkaneng Informal Settlement
- Zakhele Informal Settlement
- Popo Molefe Informal Settlement
- Dikhibidung Informal Settlement

- Bokamoso Formal and
- Lefaragatlha/Bobuantswa Formal

The newly constructed high mast lights will address some of the health and safety issues that occur during nighttime and increase economic activities in those communities. The project implementation status is currently at the planning stage.

► Rankelenyane Piggery

The Rankelenyane Piggery Project is an existing, informal subsistence piggery, consisting of six locals. The beneficiaries have now been formally registered as a formal business entity. Sibanye-Stillwater will assist the business with the construction of breeding facilities, technical support, skills training and broader market access to operate optimally. The project has potential to create job opportunities and improve the lives of the local community members

► Boschfontein Sewing

Boschfontein Sewing Project is located at Boschfontein farm in Ward 36 of the Rustenburg Local Municipality. The project comprises of 12 women between the ages of 23 to 45 years and is registered as a Propriety Limited entity. They will be supported to acquire the relevant machinery and equipment. The assistance aims to equip them with technical and business skills to operate optimally and be sustainable.

► Photsaneng Bakery

Photsaneng Bakery is located at Photsaneng Village, it is run by six women and the bakery is formally registered as Thari Ya Thitelle (Pty) Ltd. The bakery is operational; however, it still lacks various equipment to operate optimally. The women need technical training, business management training and they also need access to the market.
