YOU DID NOT WIN R900,000 ''S A SCAM

Rustenburg - Cell phone users are being bombarded with text messages saying that they won big - even when they did not enter competitions.

Congratulations, you just won R900,000 in (random competition). Your reference number is (random number). Phone (random cell number) to claim your prize.

Once the victim contacts this number scammers will either try to obtain your personal information like your identity number, banking details and pin codes or ask you to pay money to receive your so-called winnings. Other scammers send text messages

that include a link to a website. Once you click on the link, they can download malware on your phone and get access to all your personal information or could take you to a spoof website where you will be asked to enter personal or

MUNICIPALITY FAILS TO ACCOUNT FOR R80MILLION?

Unions (COSATU) revealed that Bojanala Platinum District Municipality (BPDM) is failing to account for R80million of the total amount that was paid to it by mistake by the North West Provincial Government. The labour federation has cited this as the reason why the majority of the local government employees are yet to receive their September salaries.

Recently, irate BPDM employees took to the streets of Rustenburg to protest the local governing body's failure to pay them their salaries on time. Angry employees burnt tyres in the central business district, attempted to set a municipal building on fire and dumped garbage inside the BPDM council chambers during the protest.

Platinum Weekly established that as of Tuesday 15



Firefighters extinguished the tyres set alight during the protest.

October, most of the municipal workers have not yet received their September salaries.

COSATU provincial secretary for the North West, Kopano Konopi, said BPDM municipal manager Pogiso Shikwane and chief financial officer Olga Ndlovu are under investigation for failing to account for money that was erroneously paid to the municipality.

He said: "The equitable share is not being paid to the municipality by treasury because the municipality has used about R80million of the R134million that was wrongfully transferred by mistake. The equitable share will not be paid until the R80 million has been accounted for."

It is reported that the R134 million was meant for the Rustenburg Local Municipality

incident which occurred in 2017. On Monday 14 October, James Papapa Maeso was handed the heavy sentence after he was convicted of robbing and killing 35-year old Goitsemang Francina Mororo in the Rustenburg central strict

Rustenburg police spokesperson sergeant Ofentse Mokgadi said: "James, who was a trolley porter at that time, brutally stabbed Goitsemang as she was walking from work to the taxi

rank." After the police were informed of the robbery and murder, James was eventually apprehended following investigations George Brander, colonel Sam Tlholoe and detective constable Keorapetse
