Rustenburg – After an impressive 10-year football career that saw him playing for various clubs in the South African topflight league, Coldrin Coetzee is now passing the knowledge he has gained to young players. Coldrin, who played for the likes of Platinum Stars, Free State Stars, Ga-Rankuwa and Milano United, is now the coach of the Rustenburg-based Athletico Football Club (AFC) under 17 team. He goes about his duties seriously and plays a key role in moulding raw, young talent to help young players to realise their full potential. He has the desire to instil a strong work ethic

among the young players so that they are also able to contribute positively to society. "Football is more than what you see with your eyes and more than what you interpret with your ears," Coldrin said, describing his coaching techniques. TOP ACCOUNTING LEARNERS

Rustenburg – The South African Institute of Professional Accountants (SAIPA) announced the top ten Grade 11 and Grade 12 learners for the 2019 National Accounting Olympiad (NAO) in North West. SAIPA technical and standards executive Faith Ngwenya congratulated the students on their achievement. "To do so well when competing against so many other provincial students is a remarkable feat," she says. Learners who scored equal marks shared the honour of being joint winners in a given position.

- Out of 17 schools, 30 students made top 10 for Grade 11. The best NW performing schools were Nur Ul Iman Muslim School and Selly Park Secondary School – both from Rustenburg – who shares fourth place. Lebone II College of The Royal Bafokeng and The High School for Girls Potchefstroom came in third.
