# AFRICA KOREA



**Phokeng/ Rustenburg** – Renowned tourist destinations as well as a strong mining and agricultural industry throughout the North West province have caught the eye of entrepreneurs from South Korea, who are now exploring various local investment options. The entrepreneurs, who hail from the Gyeongsangbuk-do province, paid a visit to Phokeng just outside Rustenburg on Saturday 2 November. They held discussions with North West premier Tebogo Mokgoro and other senior government officials. The deliberations hinged around how the North West Development Corporation (NWDC) can assist the South Korean investors to tap into the various business opportunities available. The vice governor of the South Korean province of Gyeongsangbuk-do, Cheol-Woo Lee, said the North West province had excellent facilities that make it a very attractive investment opportunity. Joong Ha Hwang, director general for investment promotion in the Gyeongsangbuk-do province, echoed similar sentiments: "We are promoting trade investment opportunities between South Africa and South Korea." Following previous deliberations that business persons and government leaders from the two provinces have held in the past, premier Mokgoro emphasised the need for the two parties to sign agreements that would pave way for investment. Premier Mokgoro was optimistic that the cooperation between the two provinces would result in the creation of employment opportunities for many young people in the North West province. The vice governor of Gyeongsangbuk-do last visited the North West province in 2008. The relationship between the two provinces was established in 1998.

The vice governor of the South Korean province of Gyeongsangbuk-do, Cheol-Woo Lee, exchanged gifts with North West premier professor Tebogo Mokgoro after the meeting.
