Rustenburg - On Friday 17 January, Impala Platinum mine awarded first aid certificates to ten educators from three schools located in Luka village. A team from Impala's Rustenburg operations, led by general manager Joseph Tsiloane and health, safety and environment group executive, doctor Jon Andrews awarded the certificates. Bishop Tyira and Peter Mokoena, senior managers from Impala's health services who arranged and provided the training to the educators, were also present.

In total, 32 educators from Impala's host communities received training in November 2019. The ten educators who received their certificates on Friday represented Luka Primary School, Ramotse Primary School and Mogono Primary School. All situated in Luka, 23 other educators from the Impala host communities of Lefaragatlha, Kanana and Phokeng have also passed their first aid training and will be receiving their certificates.

Impala acknowledged the educators for completing essential medical emergency and first aid training and the mining company also donated emergency medical care equipment, including three stretchers per school and three first aid kits.

The 32 educators underwent an intensive three-day training, provided by the first aid team from Impala's Medical Services. The training is accredited with the South African Red Cross Society and the Health and Welfare Education and Training Authority (HWSeta). Doctor Andrews said: "We are proud of the first group of educators who completed our first aid and medical emergency training. We believe the training will enable the educators to help those around them in the event of a medical emergency." Doctor

Andrews added that having acquired these skills, the educators are now able to apply immediate first aid at school and in their communities, ensuring that the injured are treated quickly and on-site before being transported or before emergency medical services

Impala will continue its training in first aid and medical emergency during 2020, offering training for educators from the remaining 11 schools from its

Doctor Andrews said: "The Impala chief executive officer, Mark Munroe, is determined to have educators who have been trained in medical emergency in every school in all communities around our operations. For Impala this initiative goes beyond providing medical emergency training. It is part of Impala's greater safety initiative, to ensure communities are aware of the risks which might affect their health and are more safety conscious". The mine also has an arrangement with the Bafokeng to work together whenever there is a need to airlift patients in distress. Impala general manager Joseph Tsiloane said: "Impala is committed to providing essential support and empowering local communities to become selfsufficient. By conducting medical emergency skills training, providing essential medical kits and by working together, we ensure we are extending our values of respect and care into the communities who host our mining operations." He added that Impala was honoured and privileged to be part of this initiative to provide support to the surrounding schools and host communities.

Impala also provides a range of other health and medical support services in the community.
