IMPALA MINE PROCESSING DEPARTMENT DONATES FEMININE HYGIENE PRODUCTS TO 600 GIRLS

Luka – South Africa is a country where approximately three million teenage girls miss school every month because they cannot afford to buy the necessary feminine hygiene products.

This equates to around 25% of their learning missed during a school year, putting them at a serious disadvantage compared to boys.

This fact inspired employees from Impala Platinum's processing department to collect money to buy sanitary towels for approximately 600 girls from two local schools.

The initiative, championed by processing sampling manager Tumelo Masango, received resounding support from her colleagues when the decision was made to make the donation from the processing team.

The initiative was organised under the banner of Impala's Women-In-Processing, a women's forum whose aim is to help advance issues related to female employees at the mine.

The sanitary towels were handed to girls from Thethe Secondary School and Molotlegi Secondary School, both in Luka village, by members of Impala's processing department.

Masango said she was proud to be part of an initiative to help girls stay in school as it is critical for young girls, especially in rural areas, to get an education.

"This is a small gesture from Impala's processing team, one which we hope will go a long way to ensuring you attend school regularly throughout the year, which will make it possible for you to achieve the goals you have set for yourselves," Masango said.

Masango encouraged the girls to work hard in their studies.

"Hopefully, some of you will do well enough to apply for scholarships from Impala as we would love to have more young women from the communities around our operations working on the mine, which offers many different opportunities".

Molotlegi Secondary School Grade 12 learner, Tshwarelo Mere, said the donation was important as not all the learners come from families which can afford to buy sanitary towels. Her message to the other girls was for them to work hard with the aim of "succeeding against whatever stood in their way". Mere said she intends pursuing a career in medicine after completing matric.

Thethe Secondary School learner Regomoditswe Mputle, said she was overwhelmed by this good gesture from Impala and that this was clear proof the mine has their interests at heart and the donation will make a difference in their lives.

On behalf of Thethe Secondary School management and the learners, Geography head of department Boitumelo Modisakeng thanked Impala for the offer and concluded with the Setswana idiomatic expression that "*Ngwana ke sejo wa tlhakanelwa*" – meaning, it takes a village to raise a child.

Masango said it is important girls are given an equal chance to reach their full potential.

"We hope that this small gesture by the minerals processing team will help the girls do just that. We wish them well in their studies."
