**Mogwase** – Rodney Molotsi (57) was arrested on Saturday 30 May for illegal mining activities and appeared before the Mogwase Magistrates' Court on Monday where he was granted R2,000 bail. During his arrest, trucks loaded with 170 tonnes of chrome estimated to be worth about R2.6 million were seized by members of the Hawks. Hawks North West spokesperson captain Tlangelani Rikhotso said personnel from their unit were assisted by members of the Rustenburg Flying Squad, the Department of Mineral Resources and a team from the South African National Defence Force (SANDF). "Upon arrival at one of the sites, some of the

suspects spotted the police and fled the scene. One suspect was apprehended," Rikhotso said. "He was arrested on charges of illegal mining and further charges cannot be ruled out." Investigations continue.

## WILL HE CONFESS TO POISONING HIS SONS?

**Brits** – The plea of a man accused of murdering his two sons by allegedly poisoning them will come under the spotlight when his trial at the Brits Magistrates' Court eventually begins. The murder accused, Dannyboy Fitsos Khumalo, will appear before the court on Wednesday 10 June for his bail hearing.

Police spokesperson brigadier Sabata Mokgwabone said 38-year old Khumalo confessed to killing his two sons during a meeting with a magistrate on Tuesday 19 May, moments before he made his first court appearance. He was remanded in custody when he appeared again in court on 2 June. Although the trial is yet to get underway, the question on everyone's mind is: Will Khumalo plead guilty under oath, when he eventually takes to the witness stand?

Mogwabone explained that although Khumalo confessed to a magistrate, it is his plea in court that will influence how

his trial will proceed. "He confessed but not in court," Mokgwabone told *Platinum Weekly*.

Khumalo was arrested on 18 May following the death of his sons, aged 11 and 12 years. Initially, the suspect allegedly informed the police that the boys had died from drinking rat poison. This was after their bodies were discovered at Valkop Plot in Assen, near Brits.

However, Khumalo was arrested and charged with two counts of murder after police investigations suggested that he poisoned his two children. Condemning the incident, North West provincial commissioner lieutenant general Sello Kwena conveyed his condolences to the family.



## PROTESTORS DAMAGE HOUSES, BURN SUBSTATION

**Zinniville/ Rustenburg** – A house in Kanna Street in Zinniville was among the numerous residential properties that were damaged on Wednesday 3 June during a protest by a group of dwellers from the Reutlwile informal settlement.

The protest started soon after personnel from the Rustenburg Local Municipality's public safety unit disconnected illegal electricity connections that were allegedly being used by those living in the informal settlement.

"A group of the protestors threw stones, breaking our windows. Protesters damaged some houses, trying to set it alight. The protestors burnt tyres and we are requesting the police to investigate this matter," a resident told *Platinum Weekly*.

A burnt substation and the charred remains of burnt tyres were seen by *Platinum Weekly* during a visit on 4 June to one of the scenes.

Police spokesperson captain Elsabé Augoustides said an investigation is underway. "Police were deployed at 10:00 after they were informed about the protests. The situation has calmed down and no arrests have been made yet."
