UNLAWFUL LAND INVASIONS

Rustenburg – On Wednesday 15 July, personnel from the Rustenburg Crime Combatting Unit (RCCU) were called in to demolish structures that were being established by a group of people on a piece of land situated along the R510, just outside Rustenburg. Part of the land is currently being used as a site establishment office by a company involved in the Rustenburg Rapid Transport (RRT) project.

The group was dispersed and an overnight patrol around the area by the police and members of the South African National Defence Forces (SANDF) prevented further illegal activities. This is the second incident in less than a week that land invaders have been stopped from erecting shacks on municipal land. **Photo:** The city's crime combating unit demolished the illegal structures.

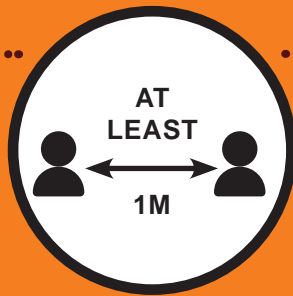
MAJOR INCIDENT AVERTED
