North West crime statistics 2019/2020 summary.

North West - The national crime statistics for 2019/20 have been published. This was done ahead of the usual date in September, as the South Africa Police Service (SAPS) plans to release the statistics every quarter going forward.

There has been a decrease in contact related crimes, property-related crimes and other serious crimes. However, murders remain high with a 1.4% increase and sexual offences have increased with 1.7%. During 2019/2020, a staggering 21,325 murders were reported, indicating that around 58 people are murdered in the country every day. This shows an increase of 303 cases compared to the 21,022 in 2018/2019.

In his address on Friday 31 July, police minister general Bheki Cele said: "In contact crimes, particularly murder, we have recorded a trend of halving the case increase in the past three years. In 2017/18 the case difference was 1,320. In 2018/19 the case difference was 686. In 2019/20 we have recorded a case difference of 303."

Sexual offences have become a growing concern in all communities. A total of 53,293 sexual offence cases were reported in 2019/2020. "This category of crime has terrorised most households and communities as most of these crimes happen behind closed doors," Cele

He also noted that it is troubling that educational institutions are becoming hotbeds for sexual violence, 380 cases of rape were reported at either schools, universities, colleges, or day-care facilities.

RUSTENBURG TAXI RANK FUMIGATED

In North West, there has been a significant decrease of 10,1% in murder cases. In 2019/2020, 961 murder cases were reported compared to the 864 in 2018/2019. Sexual offences decreased with 4,9% with a total of 3,824 reported cases compared to the 4,021 of the previous year.

Rustenburg - Devastating fires have spread over the R24, Kgaswane Nature Reserve and other areas around Rustenburg since Wednesday 5 August. According to the Greater Rustenburg Fire Protection Association (GRFPA), national statistics indicate that 90% of wildfires are caused by human negligence and only 10% by lightning. Runaway fires are often a

- result of human activity and fall into three categories: Malicious - Fires are set deliberately with malicious
- Negligent Fires which could have been avoided with even the most basic precautions, like not burning trash in the heat of the day or when there is wind, or failing to clear a fire-safe area, devoid of combustible material around open fires or ashpits.
- Accidental Fires that happen even when all reasonable precautions were taken.

Although landowners or land users do not have to belong to a Fire Protection Association (FPA), all landowners on whose land veldfires may start or burn or spread have legal obligations and responsibilities in terms of the National Veld Fire and Forest Act and municipal by-laws. In areas where wildfires are a high risk, FPA's provide a platform for rural owners and managers of land to cooperate in the effective management and prevention of veldfires. The final

responsibility for veldfire management lies with the owner of the land.

No burning of fire breaks is allowed in the GRFPA area of jurisdiction between 30 June and 31 October. The risk of runaway fires during this period is high. In addition to this fire restriction period there is a fire ban period where no open-air fires are allowed. This is dictated by the Fire Danger Index (FDI) which is publicised daily during fire season, by the South African Weather Service.

Although it is too late now to burn firebreaks, one can clear firebreaks by scraping and ploughing or slashing and cutting vegetation to create an area of reduced combustible material which will slow a wildfire down and create an access point from which to fight a fire. The GRFPA is one of 20 registered FPA's in the North West province. The GRFPA boundaries correspond with the municipal boundaries of the Rustenburg Local Municipality. Also included are the rural areas between Buffelspoort and Mooinooi and Pilanesberg National Park.

They believe that prevention is better than cure and because very few properties that border 'wildland' are immune to annual fires, prevention and preparedness are vital to protect property and infrastructure from fire. Membership of an FPA is voluntary for private landowners, but comes with a few advantages therefore the GRFPA would like to encourage all rural landowners to join.

LAND GRAB MAYHEM IN KROONDAL

in Kroondal endured a three-day ordeal of repeatedly fending off a large group of people trying to illegally occupy a private piece of land in the area.

On Thursday 13 August, residents were shocked to find a handful of people marking off pieces of land on a property. Alarmingly, the group grew in numbers turning into a mass gathering.

Various organisations, police officials and concerned community members rushed to the scene and successfully assisted the residents to dismantle the group.

The following morning, however, the situation worsened when an even larger group of people turned up and started marking off a bigger portion on the land. They quickly placed poles and plastic bags on some areas to indicate the exact spots they intended to build structures on. The

police were called to the scene and a distress call was again sent out to other community members as the numbers of the group kept on increasing.

It quickly turned into a very tense atmosphere when the group approached nearby residential properties wielding pangas and other weapons. Some of group members threw rocks at one of the cars - leaving the residents terrified.

An eviction order that was served to the group in the afternoon resulted in some of them leaving the area.

started threatening to shoot and murder the residents. The community became hopeful at around 18:00 when the group left after tempers had cooled down. On Saturday, an even larger group turned up. They blocked the roads and the traffic came to a standstill Police were called to the scene when the group started

throwing rocks at vehicles and they were forced to use rubber bullets to disperse the crowd. Most members of the group then dispersed. A few of them made their way to the nearby

Kroondal Spar (Aug Behrens) where they threw rocks at cars. Although life has - in the meantime - gone back to normal for the community, it will be quite a while before they get over this unsettling experience.

Police spokesperson Augoustides confirmed to Platinum A car was damaged by the Weekly that three cases of malicious damage to property and one of public violence are being investigated. No arrests

have been made yet and nobody was injured.

"It was terrifying seeing people walking around with pangas and hearing others threatening to murder us", explained one of the Arnoldistad residents. "I am still not sleeping well, and we are on high alert at all times. However, I do feel a sense of comfort knowing that we have a great community that will stand together during difficult times like the one we just experienced,



A FUTURE BEYOND THE MARIKANA TRAGEDY

South Africa - In 2012, 44 mineworkers lost their lives in Marikana during the climax of a protest for better wages. Delivering the inaugural Marikana Memorial Lecture during a webinar hosted by Sibanye-Stillwater on Friday 14, professor Thuli Madonsela said: "I like the fact that Sibanye-Stillwater is putting people first, because Marikana was about people.'

Madonsela has acknowledged the progress made by Sibanye-Stillwater in assisting the victims of the Marikana tragedy to find healing and assisting them to reconstruct their lives.

Sibanye-Stillwater is providing educational support to the children of those who lost their lives during the tragedy through the 1608 Memorial Trust. An initiative started by Lonmin before it was taken over by Sibanye-Stillwater in 2019 has to date provided funding to 141 beneficiaries at a total cost of R32 million.

In his address during the webinar, Sibanye-Stillwater chief executive officer Neal Froneman said: "Whilst we acknowledge and respect the past, we want to develop a new legacy for Marikana; one where conflict is replaced by new social and economic compacts. We want it to be a new, more inclusive and sustainable legacy.

Sibanye-Stillwater recently handed over six homes to widows of the Marikana victims. The mining company is also planning to acquire a further 13 houses as part of an initiative to provide some of the widows with homes

AN EMPLOYER CAN BE HELD LIABLE FOR THE CRIMINAL ACTS OF ITS EMPLOYEE

South Africa - The question of whether an employer should be responsible for the unlawful acts of its employees have been the subject of many court cases. In one of the most recent cases, the court had to decide whether a security company should be held liable after its employee had murdered another person

The case is Stallion Security vs Van Staden. Mrs Van Staden sued Stallion Security for loss of support after one of its employees had murdered her husband. The late Mr van Staden was an employee of Bidvest at one of the three sites Stallion Security was providing security services to. Mr Khumalo was employed by Stallion

Security and was the site manager for the three Bidvest sites. He, at a certain point, decided to rob Bidvest, and during the robbery, murdered Mr van Staden. The widow of Mr van Staden sued both Mr Khumalo and Stallion Security for loss of support. Her claim against Stallion Security was based on the legal principle of vicarious liability. In terms of this principle, an employer may be held liable for the unlawful acts of its employee.

Mrs van Staden succeeded in the High Court, and Stallion Security was found to be vicariously liable. Stallion Security appealed against this judgement to the Supreme Court of Appeal.

In the Supreme Court of Appeal, the court had to decide whether Stallion Security could be held liable for the selfserving interests of its employee. The court considered some of Mr Khumalo's duties, he:

- could perform spot checks at the three Bidvest sites.
- could inspect the interior of the premises,
- ensured that the exit doors were locked,
- was given an override key to gain access to the offices, which no other security officer had access to,

was registered on Bidvest's biometric system.

On a fateful evening, Mr Khumalo entered the Bidvest premises via an emergency exit, then used the override key to gain access to the office area where he believed money was kept. He pointed a firearm at Mr van Staden and demanded cash. He later shot and killed Mr van Staden as he feared he might call the police.

The Supreme Court of Appeal reasoned that it must look objectively at whether there is a sufficiently close link between the self-serving actions of the employee and the business of the employer. If such a link does

exist, the employer may be held liable. The court held that Stallion Security furnished Mr Khumalo with much more than a mere opportunity to commit the offence:

· It enabled Mr Khumalo to enter and exit the area without detection or concern on the part of Bidvest: . He could make unannounced visits to the premises; . He had knowledge that the deceased would be working late; • He had possession of the override

key to the premises; and • The special position in which he was appointed created a material risk that Mr Khumalo might abuse his powers. The appeal was dismissed, and Stallion Security was found to be liable. A lesson to be learned from this case is that an employer can be held liable for the criminal acts of its employees, even if the employer is not negligent in its conduct. Employers must be careful of the kind and level of power given to their employees.


