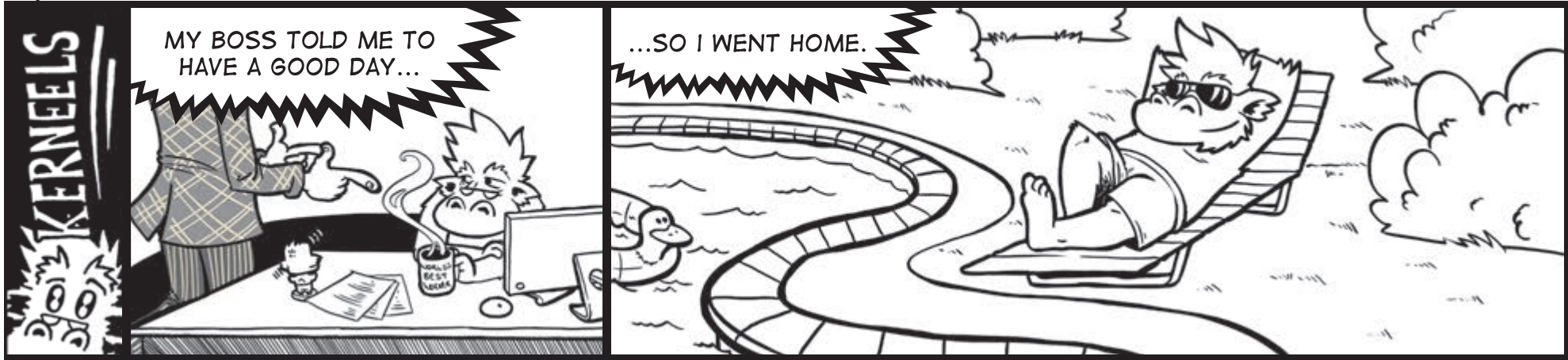

BRIDGE COLLAPSES

EILANDSKUIL ROAD CLOSED UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE

Thabazimbi – Part of the Eilandskuil road bridge at the Crocodile river near Thabazimbi has collapsed and was swept away by the force of water and the flash floods coming downstream after the heavy rains. Motorists and pedestrians are advised not to use the road to Jabulani and surrounding farms as it is closed until further notice.

10 NABBED FOR UNLICENSED FIREARMS AND STOLEN GOODS

Mooiwool/ Brits – Ten men appeared before the Brits Magistrates' Court on Friday 30 October on charges of possession of unlicensed firearms and ammunition, suspected stolen property and housebreaking implements. The accused are remanded in custody until 9 November when they are expected to make their second court appearance. All ten suspects were arrested by Mooiwool Detectives and Brits Tactical Response Team (TRT) on Wednesday 28 October following a tip-off about suspicious armed men who were spotted in Matamong informal settlement on the outskirts of Brits. It is alleged that the accused were found at a rented house. During a search of two shacks the police found three unlicensed 9mm pistols, a rifle, 38 rounds of ammunition, suspected stolen goods including cell phones, a computer monitor and various tools. Further investigations have revealed that one of the firearms was reported stolen in Tsakane, Gauteng province. Provincial commissioner of North West, lieutenant general Sello Kwena applauded all the police members involved for their rapid response and ensuring that the alleged criminals were arrested. He also thanked members of the community for working together with the police in the fight against crime.

ALARMING DROWNING INCIDENTS

NW – Police in the North West expressed their concern over an increase in the number of drowning incidents. In October and November 2020 alone, the North West police attended to four drowning incidents. The police recovered the body of a 24-year-old male on Wednesday 28 October, after he allegedly fell into the Tontonyane dam and drowned. In two other unrelated incidents that occurred in Mmabatho on Sunday 1 November and Monday 2 November, the police recovered the bodies of two men who drowned. It is alleged that the men drowned after the water swept them away as they were attempting to cross a stream.

In another incident, which occurred on Thursday 5 November at Hartbeespoort dam, police recovered the body of a 30-year-old male after he allegedly slipped off a rock into the dam and drowned. "When swimming, never swim alone. Also, ensure that the water depth is appropriate for swimming and diving," police spokesperson colonel Adèle Myburgh advised. "Never dive into muddy or unclear water. Before entering the water, always check the strength of the current. When caught in a fast-flowing river, travel feet first, this will protect the head and body from serious injury."

Tsogang out to make a lasting difference

Robega/ Rustenburg – Tsogang Civic Movement, a registered political party based in Rustenburg, outlined their intentions of participating in the 2021 elections during a lively campaign in Robega on Saturday 7 November. The party's leaders and its members were at the Robega community hall where they outlined their plan to improve the standard of living in that area. Before the formal proceedings of the day started, leaders of the political party attended the funeral of a senior citizen who had been living in the community. The Tsogang leaders further showed their care for the well-being of the community by handing over a house, that the party renovated at their own expense, to a family living in the area. The party then revealed its intentions to field candidates

in the five local municipalities of the Bojanala district during next year's elections. Secretary-general of the Tsogang Civic Movement Papi Rangwaga is confident that the party will put in a good showing during the polls. "We need, after 25-years of democracy, to reflect what we have achieved. Given the challenges we are facing in Bojanala, we believe we are well positioned to make a difference," Rangwaga said. "Many people are unemployed in Robega, there is little infrastructure development and we also need diversification of the economy to take place. It is time to uplift the spirit of the people and bring hope for a better South Africa that is free of starvation, health hazards, unemployment, economic collapse, crime, and corruption. These ills have destroyed our social fabric," he said.

THE DUMPING AND CLEANING TUG-OF-WAR

Rustenburg – In recent weeks, the *Platinum Weekly* has received many reports of community members who are volunteering to clean up public spaces and many complaints about dumping of rubbish. En route to school Hoërskool Rustenburg, Grade 9 learner Zackary Wangra felt compelled to organise a group of friends to clean up an open space between Park and Fontein streets. On the other side, the community also has people that have no qualms about leaving rubbish in any green space that is available. The natural areas and rivers around Rustenburg are not environmentally acceptable places to leave waste, even when it is just garden cuttings. The Waterval landfill site, managed by the Rustenburg Local Municipality accepts garden and other waste for controlled disposal. It is illegal to leave garden waste in an unattended area and fines can be issued for such an offence. Unfortunately, some garden service companies or private gardeners dump garden waste in green spaces and community involvement is necessary to help in the tug-of-war between those who want a clean environment and those that contribute to the mess. Check where a gardener or garden service is

disposing of your garden waste. In some areas of Rustenburg, such as Flamboyant street, which adjoin green spaces, they dump the garden waste over the wall. If you are paying someone to tidy your garden check over the wall for dumping. Also ask for proof such as a photograph of where the garden waste is being taken or a receipt from the landfill site. Natural areas support indigenous flora and fauna, and we should protect rather than disturb them by thoughtless dumping. Garden waste could contain seeds or other plant parts that can take root and start changing the natural ecosystem. Another option for garden owners is to turn garden waste into compost on their own premises. The simplest method is to create a heap in a shaded area. Try to layer cut up branches with lawn cuttings and leaves. The smaller the woody pieces the quicker the decomposition can take place. The most important thing is to keep it all moist. Turn the compost every six weeks and enjoy working with nature to nourish the soil. **Any dumping can be reported to your local ward councillor or alternatively to 083 321 4204.**

ALLEGED SUICIDE AT IMPALA HOSTEL

Rustenburg – The body of a man was found hanging from a water tank stand at Impala shaft 6 hostel on the morning of Wednesday 11 November. According to Rustenburg police spokesperson sergeant Ofentse Mokgadi, the circumstances around his death are unknown and police are investigating. We extend our sincerest condolences to the family and friends of the deceased.

KIDNAPPED BABY FOUND IN RUSTENBURG

Rustenburg – Adalia Ncebeshe (31) and Hendrik Kokoene (49) appeared before the Potchefstroom Magistrates' Court for kidnapping a four-month-old boy on Monday 9 November.

The two suspects will remain in custody until their next court appearance on 18 November for a formal bail application.

A 20-year-old woman with her baby, allegedly met Ncebeshe at a grocery store in Ventersdorp on 3 November. Ncebeshe claimed that she was from the South African Social Security Agency (SASSA) and offered to help the mother to obtain a SASSA grant for her baby.

The next day, Ncebeshe allegedly went to the 20-year-old victim's house to fetch the mother and the baby. Together they boarded a taxi in Ventersdorp, travelling to Potchefstroom. When they arrived at the Potchefstroom taxi rank, they were met by the second suspect, Kokoene who was driving a red Toyota Tazz. He drove them to a café, close to the

Potchefstroom Hospital and encouraged the mother to buy something to eat. The mother left her baby in the vehicle and went inside the shop. When she came out of the shop, the vehicle and the occupants, including her four-month-old baby was gone.

The Potchefstroom Family Violence, Child Protection and Sexual Offences Unit (FCS) investigated the case and found Kokoene in Ikageng, outside Potchefstroom on the evening of 5 November, whilst Ncebeshe and the baby were found in Rustenburg. The suspects were arrested, and the baby boy was returned to his mother, unharmed.

The provincial commissioner for the North

West, lieutenant general Sello Kwenza congratulated the investigation team for a job well done. "The police will continue to work hard to ensure the safety of the most vulnerable, women and children and to bring the perpetrators to book," he added.

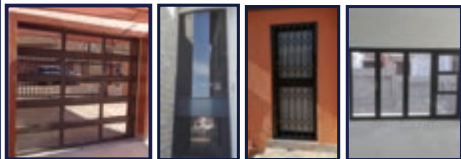

LIFE SENTENCE FOR GIRLFRIEND KILLER

Rustenburg – The Mogwase High Court handed a life sentence on Monday 2 November, to a 44-year-old Rustenburg man found guilty of the brutal murder of his former girlfriend last year. The state successfully proved that Vumile Davidson Manjo shot and killed Natasha Molapo on Saturday 2 February 2019, moments after he had arrived at her home. Apparently, Manjo could not come to terms with the decision by Molapo to end the relationship and decided to visit his former lover at her home on the fateful day of the murder. When he arrived, Manjo was denied entry into the house by the housing complex security following Molapo's instructions. He left but waited a short distance from the complex, knowing that the victim had to pass him on her way to work. The victim, driving to work and accompanied by a friend, saw his vehicle and made a sharp U-turn to return to the safety of the housing complex. Manjo pursued her to the security check point where she had stopped. He rushed over from his vehicle and shot her multiple times at close range while she was still seated in her vehicle. Molapo's traumatised friend, who was wounded during the ordeal, managed to flee the scene. Molapo was declared dead on scene by emergency and medical rescue services (EMRS) and Manjo handed himself over to the police. He was sentenced to 25 years imprisonment for murder, ten years for attempted murder, eight years for the unlawful possession of a firearm, as well as five years for the unlawful possession of ammunition. Major-general Arthur Adams applauded the investigation officer

warrant officer Thabo Mokgari for a job well done. "He did a sterling job and the judge commended him for a comprehensive murder investigation. Further, gender-based violence will not be tolerated and the safety of women and children remains a top priority," Adams said.

BULLETS FLY IN HIGH-SPEED CHASE ROBBED OF R300,000



Rustenburg – An employee who was on his way to deposit money for his company was shot at and chased by people driving a white BMW X5. After a high-speed chase he lost control of the Hyundai mini truck he was driving. The vehicle rolled, and the man managed to flee the scene before the robbers looted R300,000 from the truck. Police have confirmed that the incident occurred on Wednesday 3 November at around 10:00. "A 26-year-old employee was driving a white mini Hyundai truck in Molen Street, East End, on his way to the bank to deposit cash when he allegedly heard gun shots fired at him from behind," police spokesperson captain Elsabé Augoustides told *Platinum Weekly*. "He then noticed a white X5, with [possibly] three occupants, giving chase until Van Belkum Street where his truck rolled and landed on the fence next to the road," she added. The victim did not sustain any visible injuries. He managed to get out of the truck and run away from the pursuing robbers. The suspects took the money before they fled the scene. Police are investigating a case of armed robbery and no arrests have been made so far. Rustenburg – The Magaliesburg Biosphere Reserve save our species (SOS) Eco-rangers proved their worth when they reported uprooting of numerous the protected marula trees *Sclerocarya birrea* and other indigenous species such as aloes and euphorbias along the R104 between the Caltex garage and the conference centre. Upon investigation, *Platinum Weekly* confirmed that unnecessary environmental damage was being caused by the erection of a fence and by another party that was digging the ground to lay fibre. Raising concerns regards environmental degradation does not mean being obstructive to development but rather holding organisations accountable to practice sustainable development and committing to a green code of practice. An environmental management plan detailing how an activity should be done sensitively and onsite monitoring of operations promotes job creation and preserves the aesthetics and cultural and natural heritage of an area. Organisations are quick to claim on their websites and brochures that they practice sustainable development, but many take a shortcut when they believe that they won't be held accountable. It is not only uprooting of plants that are a concern but also debarking of trees as equipment scrapes past. Removal of bark makes the tree vulnerable to fire and viral infection. Neatly prune branches at a diagonal to ensure that the tree can recover rather than ripping off and leaving a jagged edge. Replace outdated linear thinking with an organic perspective. Contractors have set precedents of best practice in South Africa by routing roads and pipelines around trees instead of through them.

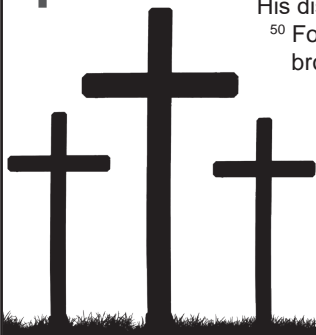

WHERE IS THE SPIRIT OF *BATHO PELE*? [LETTER TO THE EDITOR]

In the 60's and early 70's, we were subjected to the illogical Group Areas Act and forcibly removed from our birthplaces in central Rustenburg and literally dumped in nameless areas away from town. The present day, Zinniaville and Karlienpark, were established after much effort by the community. Despite colossal struggles we seldom experienced extended periods of no water and no electricity. Now we often go for more than five days without these basic services. Disgusting sewerage flows down our streets which are also dark and dangerous because of a lack of streetlights. Our soccer grounds are neglected and not even fit for cattle grazing let alone any type of sport. Potholes are marring the streets, refuse accumulates all around us, illegal businesses are springing up like mushrooms and the list continues. Zinniaville and Karlienpark are a disgrace. Basic services are non-existent which is in total violation of the constitution of our democracy... an ideal we struggled for. Are we enjoying our *new* South Africa? Are we living a better life for all as

promised by our leaders? Are we part of a 'world class city' that we so often hear about? Are we preparing for quality living for generations to come? Or are we simply going down the '*Dorpspruit*' mud and all? The irony of the situation is that Zinniaville and Karlienpark are renowned for a culture of payment of exorbitant monthly electricity and water bills, rates, and taxes. On a daily basis we inhale a nauseating and unhygienic stench which makes a mockery of 'the right to a clean environment' as enshrined in our unique constitution. The project is primarily based on the South African Constitution that affords all South Africans the right to equal education and to be treated with dignity and respect. It seeks to help redress inequalities in the library and information sector by improving existing services, developing infrastructure, stocking public libraries, and enabling local communities to have access to information and knowledge to improve their socio-economic conditions. The visually impaired community can look forward to the latest ICT resources in community libraries equipped with suitable furniture and assistive technological equipment which includes Victor readers, document readers, computer-based

software like Jaws, Zoom text, Braille and audio books.
