Whatever your circumstances are, no matter how afraid you are or whatever your reasons may be for deciding not to keep your baby, please do the right thing and follow the right procedures to ensure the life of the child is protected.

Môrester Kinderhuis director Helen Lotz, based in Rustenburg, deals with cases like these regularly. Lotz currently provides a safe place for abandoned children. Lotz advises that should you decide not to keep your baby, to at least go to a hospital to give birth. This will not only give the baby a chance on life – it is also beneficial for your health. If you do this through the correct channels the baby will also receive an ID number which will help with the adoption process of which the mother has 90 days to change her mind.

Relentless in his effort, the man followed me. He continued to hit me wherever he could, the blows fell all over my body. I breathed my last and lav motionless in a pool of blood.

My death was, apparently, not enough for this After being tormented for months and my mean man. He continued to take out his rage on me, even after I was gone.

> Afterwards, he instructed one of his workers to bring a bag and although Tannie Rina who was now emotionally stressed by the ordeal - begged him to let her bury me, these pleas fell on deaf ears. I was thrown into the bag and left on a rubbish dump like a piece

The post-mortem revealed that Killer was struck repeatedly on the cranium, leading to acute haemorrhage, swelling of tissue (brain and left eye) and multiple fractures. In November 2021, Platinum Weekly established that a case of animal cruelty as well as other charges is being investigated by the Brits South African Police Services (SAPS). Due to Covid-19 and the accused being hospitalised, a new trial date is yet to be set.

Hijacked truck intercepted

Rustenburg - A collective effort by police and BCI Security led to the arrest of the driver of a hijacked truck after it was intercepted at Olifantsnek on the R24 outside Rustenburg.

The police highway patrol was alerted after the truck was hijacked on 7 December along the N14 in Johannesburg. The arrest was made a few hours later.

ATM BOMBERS, **GUNSHOTS IN MARIKA**

Marikana – Two suspected automated teller seven days after reports of an ATM bombing Marikana on Tuesday 14 December after police discovered explosives in the bags they were carrying. When they spotted the cops in a white VW polo with no number plates. patrolling the area near the ATMs, they fled – and the cops gave chase.

Rustenburg Magistrates' Court Wednesday 15 December for attempted ATM bombing and the possession of explosives.

More explosives materials were discovered by the police upon their return to the same area where the suspects were initially spotted and arrested.

Police spokesperson brigadier Sabata Mokgwabone said further investigations are underway. He added that at this stage, the suspects who were arrested on 14 December cannot be linked to the first ATM bombing on 7 December, "But it has not been ruled out either," Mokgwabone said.



manager of the supermarket. They demanded cash and cellphones before they fled the scene. No one sustained injuries during the incident. Said Rustenburg police spokesperson captain Elsabe Augoustides: "Police are investigating a case of armed robbery. No arrests have been made as yet.

[Letter to Eskom]

Good morning Mxxxxx,

Referring to our telephone conversation earlier this morning. We as a community in the area of the Shylock and Moedwil substations feel that something needs to be done urgently to stop the ongoing vandalism and destruction of vital Eskom property. I have been the head of the Buffelshoek Farmwatch for the last twelve years (callsign L9WG) and the problem has never been at such a critical stage as right now.

We as a community want to work with Eskom

The area around the Shylock substation has partially been cleared of trees and bushes and if we want to clean it up properly, we need written permission from Eskom. The community will provide labour to do that.

Mr. Jxxxxx Sxxxxx has spoken to the management of the silica mine close by and they have agreed to send a front-end loader and a grader the first week in January to clear a proper wide border around the substation in order to increase visibility for the security guards to minimise the chances of them being caught off guard.

We really think that it is time for the SANDF to be deployed at these substations to try and curb this problem. The criminals have been destroying this property for months and they keep coming back because there is no resistance.

They come in large numbers and heavily armed, and the security guards don't stand a chance because they are outnumbered and outgunned. As a community we cannot guard the substation because we don't have the necessary resources and equipment and we also don't have the legal right to respond. As you know this is costing Eskom millions of rands in repairs and it has now reached a stage where the teams doing the repairs can't stay ahead of the criminals responsible for all the sabotaging because that is clearly what it is: SABOTAGE.

The SANDF has 66,500 active troops and 15,000 reserve troops at their disposal and we cannot see why they cannot be deployed to defend these key points.

keep the lights on and there is no need to kick them while they are down by setting them up for failure. We need to protect our source of electricity.

With the recent vandalism of substations around the country we have to stand together. Local community member, Deon Olivier (Rustenburg) wrote an insightful letter offering to assist Eskom and proposing that the South African National Defence Force (SANDF) assist in protecting our substations which is critical for a thriving economy.

The cruel side of fireworks

Rustenburg - The festive season is upon us and while we all look forward to having fun with our loved ones and friends and celebrating the New Year's Day, most animals spent Old Year's Eve in fear.

For the Rustenburg Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SPCA), 31 December and 1 January are some of their busiest days of the year.

Says Rustenburg SPCA manager Marisa Kruger: "Animals, whether its birds, dogs, cats or even squirrels are not taken into account when people decide to use fireworks. It has a traumatic effect on the animals, some of them get hurt, some of them get lost and some die. Our workload is huge after New Year's Eve. I stand in amazement at people's ignorance about the effects that fireworks have on animals, and I wish fireworks would be banned altogether."

Do the responsible thing and report fireworks to the Rustenburg Police Station on 014 590 4115.

According to Specialist Investigators' Mike Bolhuis, the noise of fireworks leads many dogs to perceive it as a threat and triggers a fight or flight response. Other signs of anxiety are barking, restlessness, panting, pacing and whining. Frightened cats appear startled, run away or hide away. Other signs cats might show are either toileting in the house or excessive grooming. It is breeding season for many species of birds and the noise may startle mother birds off their nests - leaving the eggs unprotected and exposed.

Fireworks and the law:

- The use of fireworks in South Africa is regulated by by-laws under the Explosives Act of 1956.
- This means that you need to check in with your local authorities to ensure that there are no by-laws that apply in your city or town.
- One may not light or ignite fireworks in a place where animals are present (R1,000 fine). This includes your own home.
- Fireworks may not be set off in any public place. This includes in parks, on the pavement or on streets.
- Shopping malls, restaurants, liquor stores and clothing retailers are also off-limits.
- Fireworks may not be sold by street vendors, hawkers or at any informal openair facilities.
- Anyone who wishes to sell fireworks must have a valid licence, which is issued by adoption at the Rustenburg SPCA.

- the chief inspector of the Department of Explosives.
- It is illegal to detonate fireworks within 200 metres of a hospital, clinic, petrol station, old-age home, nursing home, or animal welfare organisation or institution.
- No one under the age of 16 is allowed to purchase or set off fireworks.
- It is unlawful for any person to point or direct a firework at another person, animal, building or motor vehicle.
- No person or organisation is allowed to present fireworks displays unless formally authorised to do so by the Council (at least 14 days' notice).
- Authorisation is also required from the Civil Aviation Authority and the Chief Inspector of Explosives.
- A pyrotechnician and SA Police Services explosives expert must be present at all
- Failure to comply with any of the above could result in a hefty fine or even jail time.

A few tips shared by Mike Bolhuis

- Microchip your pets.
- If need be medicate your pets with antianxiety medication, but, consult with your veterinarian first.
- Create a safe space for your pets. Turn off other noise in this space as a TV or radio will only exacerbate the problem.
- Keep the space locked and ensure that the pets are not able to escape but also, they should not be able to hurt themselves by breaking through a window or jumping over something when they panic.
- Close windows and curtains to muffle the sound of fireworks.
- Specialised vests, wraps or coats can be bought, it is said that such pressure garments have a calming effect on pets.

Ramochana/ Rustenburg - The electricity challenges we have been facing in Ramochana ward 39 for more than 5 years now are unbearable.

I have witnessed some residents stealing municipal electricity and reselling it to people who don't have it, in the outskirts of Ramochana. This causes problems for the residents of D4 because the electricity keeps on tripping.

Several distribution boxes have also been vandalised or burnt beyond repair, leaving residents without electricity for days and the municipality losing millions.



SAPS and traffic officers issued tickets to offenders during "Operation Basadi".

Rustenburg - Police in Rustenburg took part in SAPS' provincial Operation Basadi conducted on Monday 6 December. On this day, a total of 129 suspects were arrested in the province. In Rustenburg, the national deputy police commissioner: crime detection - lieutenant general Liziwe Ntshinga - handed out gifts and food hampers to nine survivors of gender-based violence. "With these Christmas presents, we want to show you that you are not alone," Ntshinga said.

Rustenburg Local Municipality member of mayoral committee for Public Safety councillor Virginia Mputle - who accompanied Ntshinga - commended warrant officer Bonita Dry of Ikageng Detectives and sergeant Obakeng Rasego of the Rustenburg Family Violence, Child Protection and Sexual Offences (FCS) unit for their part in ensuring the conviction of Thabang Gordon Moloi and Tshepo Ben Moloi.

The duo - who are not related - were handed lengthy jail terms for crimes ranging from kidnapping, rape, robbery, murder to escape from lawful custody.

Meanwhile, some of the suspects arrested during Operation Basadi have already appeared before various courts.







With the scourge of rape and violence against women on the rise in communities across the country, Glencore Ferroalloys has stepped up to contribute towards the fight against these crimes by supporting government's Thuthuzela Care Centres initiative and empowering women in their local communities.

Thuthuzela Care Centres are one-stop facilities that serve as a critical part of the country's anti-rape strategy. The aim of the centres is to reduce secondary victimisation, improve conviction rates and reduce the cycle time for finalisation of cases.

Glencore Ferroalloys recently committed R4 million towards the building of another Thuthuzela Care Centre at the Dilokong Hospital, located at Gowe, a rural village in the Fetakgomo Tubatse Local Municipality in Limpopo. The Dilokong Hospital Thuthuzela Care Centre being built by Glencore is expected to be completed in the first quarter of 2022.

Glencore CSR Superintendent, Ntombizodwa De Toit, said she looks forward to a time when construction of the centre is completed so it can begin the important work of supporting women and children who are victims of rape in the community.

"As an organisation we pride ourselves in ensuring that we live our values, and with this particular project our values of responsibility, openness, and simplicity resonate most," she said during a recent sod turning ceremony at the site.

De Toit said this initiative by Glencore is in response to one of the biggest challenges faced in the country.

"It is a challenge that needs all hands on deck and most importantly, it is a challenge that calls for strong partnerships because GBVF affects everyone irrespective of age, gender or nationality. To roll this project out, we aligned ourselves to Pillar 4 of the NSP which speaks to the integrated care and support of GBVF survivors and their families, and we are proud to start the process of ensuring that our community members have access to their own Thuthuzela Care Centre," she said.

The new centre will be built within the Dilokong Hospital which services 166 villages with an estimated population of 335 676. This is a welcome intervention in an area characterised by a weak economic base, inadequate infrastructure, major service backlogs, dispersed human settlements and high poverty levels.

Glencore Ferroalloys also recognised women empowerment as an important tool which can go a long way in giving a voice to the voiceless. On 26 November 2021, Glencore Ferroalloys in partnership with the Department of Mineral Resources and Energy (DMRE), Women in Mining Advisory Committee (WIMAC) and Mine Health and Safety Council (MHSC), officially launched their 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence and Femicide (GBVF) awareness campaign. Farewell Frikkie Pretorius

Pretorius was born in Rustenburg and raised on a farm in Marikana. He matriculated at Hoërskool Rustenburg in 1979, whereafter he pursued his BJuris degree at UNISA. In 1985, and after obtaining his degree, Frikkie started his career as a public prosecutor.

By the end of 1986, and after serving as regional court prosecutor in Rustenburg, Frikkie resumed his studies and obtained his LLB degree at the North-West University (Potchefstroom Campus).

During January 1989, Frikkie was appointed as a candidate attorney at Van Velden-Duffey. He was admitted as an attorney on 12 February 1991 and appointed as partner of Van Velden-Duffey by March of the same year. Since then, he has made a major impact and has become a household name in the community.

Pretorius dedicated much of his time to serving on various committees of the Law Society of the Northern Provinces, the Legal Practice Council, local governing bodies and community programmmes. He will be remembered for his involvement in several controversial murder trials as well as the Marikana enquiry. His excellent legal mind and charismatic personality will be greatly



Chicken bobotie snacks

Rustenburg – Boep Pensie owner Claudie Kriel started making platters three years ago. She simply loves cooking and decided to create affordable platters.

"I take great pride in the food that I prepare. Nothing is made beforehand, it's freshly prepared," Claudie said.

Her chicken bobotie snacks is a great hit and she was gracious enough to share her recipe with *Platinum Weekly* readers.

Ingredients:

- 1 whole chicken
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- · spices of your choice
- salt
- 1 packet creamed chicken soup
- 1 tablespoon curry
- a pinch of turmeric
- 50ml lemon juice
- 1 egg
- 1 large onion, finely chopped
- 2 table spoons apricot jam
- a dash of milk
- a hand full of raisins

Instructions:

- 1. Cook the chicken thoroughly.
- Deskin and debone the chicken before cutting it into small pieces.
- Combine all of the ingredients (except the eggs and milk) together.
- Place a spoon full of the mixture in a greased muffin pan.
- Mix the eggs and milk together and pour over the chicken mixture.
- 6. Bake for 30 minutes at 180°C.

Uprooting invasive alien plants

Rustenburg - Invasive alien plants introduced to azedarach), lantana (Lantana camara), senna South Africa from other countries often threaten biological diversity and lead to environmental harm if left to thrive

Without natural enemies, these plants reproduce and spread rapidly, taking valuable water and space from indigenous plants and causing extensive damage to the environment.

Mountain Club of South Africa (MCSA) volunteers from Magaliesberg see the removal of these invasive plants as an important part of their conservation efforts. The MCSA is more than 100 years old and is one of the oldest mountaineering clubs in the world. Club members, often accompanied by friends and relatives take part in the conservation of mountain areas through fire management, erosion control on roads and paths, weeding or hacking of invasive plants, removal of snares as well as funding research on conservation-related initiatives.

MCSA climbing convenor Magaliesberg section Roger Diamond said each weekend, volunteers spend time removing invasive plants along various trails. They hack and uproot the weeds for many hours at Castle Gorge and other areas along the

Some of the invasive plants common in the Magaliesberg area include syringa (Melia

(Senna occidentalis) pompom (Eupatorium macrocephalum), crofton weed (Ageratina Adenophora), inkberry (Cestrum laevigatum) as well as prickly pear cactus (Opuntia ficus-indica).

"We enjoy spending time in healthy natural environments, so keeping them free of invasive alien plants is imperative to preserving our heritage and enabling our members and the public to enjoy nature at its best," Diamond said.

He added that invasive alien plants bring with them an increase in the risk of fire and higher rates of water usage which leads to clogging and damage of waterways. These unwanted plants also transform the indigenous veld into an impenetrable thicket that has no ecological value.

"In other words, the local wildlife derive no benefit from these plants and so the ecosystem is gradually destroyed as the invaders multiply. Without losing sight of the seriousness of the work we do, we have a lot of fun, explore hidden parts of the Magaliesberg that hikers and climbers never see and the team spirit on a weeding trip is the best," Diamond said.

"Getting sweaty, scratched and burrowing deep into a kloof on a hot day is rewarded by being in nature so fully with a keen and fun bunch of weeders,' he concluded.

The awards celebrate companies that are building a better South Africa and 2021 is the second year in a row that the SPAR Rural Hub Programme has been awarded the coveted accolade.

HIS GRACE, ARCHBISHOP THABO MAKGOBA VISITS MARIKANA

On 15 and 16 November 2021, Sibanye-Stillwater hosted His Grace the Anglican Archbishop of Cape Town, Thabo Makgoba, who is the patron of the Marikana Renewal programme, on his first visit to the greater Marikana area. The purpose of the visit was to meet with stakeholders as a part of the inclusive engagement process to create a renewed Marikana.

His Grace was joined by Dr Mamphele Ramphele, co-founder of Reimagine SA which is an independent social facilitator engaged by Sibanye-Stillwater to ensure that the pillars of renewal Honour; Engage and Create are realised. Some of the key deliverables of the Marikana Renewal Programme include; the finalisation of the houses for the widows and their children; educational support; support for Bapo Ba Mogale; and social programmes in partnership with government and the community.

During his time in Marikana His Grace held meetings with non-governmental organisations and municipal managers to engage with them on progress being made on partnership programmes aimed at improving livelihoods and the social environment. His visit included a tour of the community where he viewed some of the houses that have been handed over to widows affected by the Marikana tragedy and where he was able to interact with dependents. His Grace and the delegation also met and engaged with Bapo Ba Ga Mogale chief, Kgosi Kgolo Nkwane Andrew Mogale, and the members of the traditional council at the Bapo Ba Ga Mogale Royal palace.

On the final day Archbishop Makgoba was taken to the site of the tragedy, the Koppie at Wonderkop, where a prayer and reflection session was held.

Dr Mandla Yawa who lost his brother in the events of August 2012 joined His Grace on the visit to the Koppie. Dr Yawa is a beneficiary of the 1608 Memorial Trust, an educational trust set up to provide education support for children that were affected by the Marikana tragedy. He recently received his Doctorate in Animal Science from the University of Fort Hare. Our congratulations go to him for this admirable achievement.

HONOURING THE ELDERLY

In September 2021, Sibanye-Stillwater, in partnership with Bapo Ba Mogale Traditional Council, officially handed over the Reteng Masilo Disability Centre. The centre was established by the late Reteng Masilo to support and empower the elderly and people living with disabilities in Segwaelane, Madibeng.

Reteng Masilo initially housed the beneficiaries in his home, as there were no facilities available for the elderly in the community. When the beneficiaries increased, there was a need for a facility that could accommodate everyone. Sibanye-Stillwater and Bapo Ba Mogale Traditional Council then built the Reteng Masilo Disability Centre for the elderly and people living with disabilities which was completed in 2019.

The centre is now a fully functional income-generating centre with more than 90 beneficiaries. Some of the income generating activities include beadwork and farming.

The centre was initially called Segwaelane Community Centre, but has been officially renamed to Reteng Masilo Disability Centre in honor of the late Masilo who passed away in 2019.

Sibanye-Stillwater partnered with the centre to extend part of the building in order to house more victims and resolve the issue of overcrowding given the increasing number of GBV cases in the community. All contractors are required to speak to a representative from the Community Engagement and Development (CED) team to find out what skills are needed and how many contractors are required. A member of the CED team will then explain how to access specific jobs. As and when jobs are available, they are given to 13 areas on a rotational basis.

STEP 1

A requisition for labour needs to be approved and sent to Human Resources (HR) who will send back to the contractor;

A community representative will share a list of possible workers to the contractor. The contractor will follow a

process to select people who will be on the final list;

STEP 2

The HR department will send a request for the labour to the stakeholder engagement representative and the contractor who will be referred to the stakeholder engagement office;

STEP 5

The contractor then fills out a source form and send to the stakeholder engagement representative for signature;

STEP 3

The stakeholder engagement representative will introduce the contractor to a community representative

STEP 6

The assessment and evaluation of the information submitted is carried out.


