### **FAMILY WAITS SIX HOURS NEXT** TO SON'S BODY FOR CRIME SCENE PHOTOGRAPHER TO ARRIVE

Rustenburg – A grieving Rustenburg family myself, but I was helpless. It was very is still in shock after spending six hours next to their deceased son's body in the scolding heat on Sunday 22 January 2023. The 19-year-old was last seen travelling on the N4 at around 11:30

His parents received a call from a passer-by who had managed to identify their son just before 12:00. The passer-by informed them that their son had been in a car accident near Moedwil. after which they immediately rushed to the scene. They arrived at the scene at about 12:20 where they found their deceased son with his car on top of him Paramedics, police, and the Bakwena traffic police were at the scene and informed the family that the fire department, detectives, and crime scene photographer had already been informed about the accident. Sadly, nothing could be done until photos of the crime scene had been taken by the crime scene photographer.

A police officer from Swartruggens arrived at 14:30 and apologised for the missing parties and said that all the missing parties were on their way to the accident. Most of the parties arrived shortly after. Everyone, including the grieving parents, had to wait in the 35°C heat until the crime scene photographer arrived at approximately 17:30. "As a mother, I had the urge to remove my son

traumatic. We understand that there is a process, but how could it have taken so long?" asked the mother in an interview with Platinum Weekly. A local paramedic confirmed that this was not an isolated incident and said that family members often have to wait for hours at a crime scene for all the responders to arrive. According to the family, there was also uncertainty as to whose jurisdiction the accident fell under: Rustenburg, Swartruggens or Koster? The family's trauma was further prolonged as they were sent from one police station to another until they finally managed to find out that the Swartruggens police were handling the case, where they could eventually get a case number. However, the mother said that the person handling the case at Swartruggens was extremely professional and helpful. North West police spokesperson brigadier Sabata Mokgwabone said that it is not a standard procedure to wait for crime scene photographers for long hours. "However, we need to indicate that this unit is not where the management wants it to be in terms of resources. Furthermore, incidents are attended as they are reported and, in some instances, there is an order of priority which unfortunately in some cases leads to delays," he added.



Most of us know Stephanus Johannes Paulus Kruger, affectionately known as 'Oom Paul', as State President of the old Zuid-Afrikaanse

What you may not know, however, is that before he gained international renown, he was a successful farmer who owned and worked several farms in the Rustenburg district.

One of these farms was Boekenhoutfontein, whose buildings were devastated by the British during the Boer War. The farm passed to Kruger's decendents following his death in 1904 and was declared a national monument in 1971. The property was acquired by the Recreation Africa Group some 30 years ago and has since been restored to its former glory. It is now home to the Kedar Heritage Lodge, Conference Centre & Spa and the Paul Kruger Country House Museum.

### LAST POLE STANDING...

Rustenburg - On Wednesday 8 February 2023 Platinum Weekly took a drive on the N4 to take a look at what might be the last sighting of a streetlamp on a road of darkness. As you take the N4 turn-off from the Helen Joseph bridge at night, it feels like you are slowly descending into darkness. Along the road, many streetlamps have fallen at the hands of copper thieves, but one lamp remains as it stands alone and shines its last bit of light in the eerie darkness. The question is, for how long will the last pole survive? Criminals are vandalising electricity poles, digging holes, and even cutting down streetlamps to get access to the copper inside. Once the poles have been felled, criminals are also able to access the lights. Rustenburg Local Municipality spokesperson Thapelo Matebesi said that the theft of electricity cables annually costs the local government body approximately R500 million. "To curb this criminal activity the municipality through its law enforcement unit has forged a collaborative effort with the South African Police Service, Community Policing Forums, Rustenburg Crime Watch and private security establishments to eliminate this criminal activity once and for all," said Matebesi. ### Don't leave your dog in the car!

Rustenburg – Lifestyle and Rustenburg Square Centre owners and management are appealing to customers to please not leave their pets inside their vehicles. In a statement by management (on 1 February 2023), they noted that they encountered several incidents of pets being left unattended in cars on a weekly basis. "It is quite concerning that some pet owners spend hours inside the centre, only check on their pets once or twice, and have their pets do their business in the parking lot whilst not having the decency to clean up after them. They then lock their pets in their cars again and go back to their activities inside the centre," management said. According to the Rustenburg Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals manager Marisa Kruger, parked cars are like death traps for dogs. "Dogs suffer and can die if owners leave them in a car unattended. Without proper ventilation, temperatures can soar in a closed-up car. Dogs pant and can quickly overheat. Even if you leave the windows slightly open, it won't keep your car cool enough. Heatstroke can be fatal for your dog," Kruger added. With the hot temperatures, your dog can die in less time than it would take you to queue up and pay for a cup of coffee. There is no safe period for dogs to be left unattended in cars, even on cool days. The best alternative is to leave your dog at home with access to shade, fresh water and shelter. If you must take them out in the car and need

### Police apprehend murder suspects

Rustenburg - Three suspects were arrested on Tuesday 7 February 2023 for business robbery, murder, and possession of an unlicensed firearm. According to lieutenant colonel Amanda Funani, preliminary reports suggest that a group of armed men allegedly shot and fatally wounded a security officer who responded to the scene of a robbery at a supermarket in Zendeling Street, Rustenburg, on 27 January 2023. The intelligence operation was driven by the Rustenburg Detectives, Phokeng K9, Public Order Police, and Criminal Record and Crime Scene Management members. Following the incident, investigations led the police to the first suspect at a hospital in Rustenburg where he was admitted and treated for a gunshot wound. Further investigations directed the team to a house in Ramochana and a house in Sunrise Park outside Rustenburg where two suspects were arrested respectively. The suspect arrested



Rustenburg - Before the Arendskloof complex development, some of the kids walking home from Bergsig Academy used to enjoy swimming in the dams (which was much smaller at the time). In Arendskloof, everything revolves around these dams, not only for the people, but also for the birds, the insects and the fish.

Unfortunately, this harmonious existence was negatively impacted after a major sewage leak seeped into the area's water with disastrous consequences. On Saturday 4 February, dead fish started to surface at one of Arendskloof's dams while the stench of sewage made life uncomfortable for the members of this secure

The three dams in Arendskloof mostly get their water from rainfall and from a natural spring located nearby. One of the dams was polluted when a sewerage pipe burst in Arend Road during the past weekend. The sewage flowed down the road, over Vink Avenue and eventually reached one of Arendskloof's dams.

Because sewage significantly reduces the oxygen in clean water, the dam's fish population quickly started to deteriorate.

Big Time Construction's owner Jay Jay Esterhuizen who assists with the maintenance at Arendskloof, luckily had the necessary knowledge and equipment to deal with the situation. If the dead fish were left in the dam, the pollution would have been much worse. Esterhuizen and his team started removing the dead fish from the dam on Monday 6 February. To do this, they dragged a big net through the dam. By using this method, they also managed to save the fish that were still alive. At the time of going to print, it was reported that more than 400 dead carp had been removed and that they had managed to save approximately 150 others. Approximately 3,000 smaller fishranging from 5cm to 8cm—had to be relocated.

"By Tuesday, it took a team of eight people to drag the net through the dam, but when we arrived the next morning it looked like we hadn't even made a dent," Esterhuizen said in an interview with Platinum Weekly.

According to Esterhuizen, they are still expecting to remove dead fish until 10 February 2023 because they can only remove the fish as they

The fish that were saved have now been relocated to different sites in and around Rustenburg while the dead fish are being transported to a site in Hartbeespoort where they will be disposed of and

Fortunately, Esterhuizen's team managed to temporarily block off the flow of contaminated water until the Rustenburg Local Municipalitywho are currently working on the issue-manages to fix the problem. "We can only hope that the dam will be cleaned by the next heavy rainfall. In the meantime, we are doing everything we can to stop the sewage from flowing into the other two dams in Arendskloof," Esterhuizen added.

In a healthy environment, Carp reproduce relatively quickly so the population should be back on track as soon as the dam's health has been restored. All fishing activities in Arendskloof have been suspended until further notice due to the health risk.

Platinum Weekly also spoke to Arendskloof trustee André van der Merwe. "I have several properties in Arendskloof. It's a well-known complex and the residents enjoy living here. The dams are part of the appeal so we hope that the rain will help to clean up the dam," he said.

Cathy Dzerefos, a specialist registered with the South African Council for Natural Scientific Professions (SACNASP) also weighed in on the situation from an environmental standpoint. "This issue has risen because of illogical town planning and ignoring the environmental impact process. There should have been a green zone around the dam, and it should have been linked to the existing natural area. When you purchase a house, you also need to think about the natural landscape especially as we are entering a period where we can expect more floods. The owners should have asked to see the specialist reports which were commissioned before the area was developed." said Dzerefos.

Platinum Weekly reached out to the RLM and the Department of Sanitation for comment but at time of going to print we had not yet received any





Small, Micro, and Medium Enterprises (SMMEs) have received a major boost as part of Sibanye-Stillwater's Business Start-up Pitch launched in 2021 around its Marikana operations.

Phatsima Village in Rustenburg is now home to a budding essential oils enterprise, thanks to a local farming project.

The R7.3 million Phatsima Essential Oils Project is part of Sibanye-Stillwater's Mine Community Development for Social Labour Plan.

According to the Southern African Essential Oil Producers' Association, the global essential oils market will reach \$14.6 billion by the end of 2026, from \$7 billion in 2018.

Rose geranium oil has many uses in products like perfumes, lotions and soap. The oil is also used for medicinal purposes.

For the people of Phatsima and its surrounding areas, being part of the flourishing industry means more jobs will be created, resulting in an improved standard of living.

The farm pivoted into producing rose geraniums in 2021 after its initial venture into vegetables was unsuccessful.

Today, the farm has three permanent employees and 32 seasonal workers and will harvest its first market ready crop in November. Since rose geraniums take six months to grow and harvest, the farm also grows cash crops like spinach and beetroot, to generate revenue in-between.

Local farmer Obed Mokgatle, says the project has provided him and the other two beneficiaries with financial

support, and training on essential oil farming and business management.

Mokgatle explains that once harvested, the flowers will be sold to U Can Grow, a company that supports smallholder farmers, where they are processed into pure essential oil.

The farmer says he's looking forward to the business' growth in terms of scale and revenue. so the 32 seasonal workers can be employed permanently.

"Lives are going to change." says Mokgatle.

Unlike the initial venture into vegetable farming, he believes the essential oils market will be beneficial to the business and the community.

"There is progress, things are happening. We can hire people from the village, people are getting employed now, even if it's not a permanent job," he

### Leokeng gets its first Secondary School

### Leokeng e iponela sekolo sese golwana sa ntlha

Sibanye-Stillwater in partnership with the Department of Education built the first secondary school in the area. With an investment of R36.7 million, the school boasts 16 classrooms and can accommodate up to 800 learners

The new school gives learners access to a better learning environment now that their community has its own Secondary School. "I'm delighted about this. Now we don't have many learners crossing a busy road," says Leokeng Secondary School Interim Principal Andrew Tshotlhang.

Filling up the school is a work in progress, with 366 learners at present in Grades 8 and 9 only. Principal Tshotlhang is confident the number of learners attending the school will grow and the community looks forward to celebrating the first matric class in 2025.

The new facility has also brought job opportunities for young teachers, some of whom are fresh from training and others who have been teaching for just three years. Tshotlhang explains that the school has 14 teachers and applications are also open for management positions.

As for his own role, Tshotlhang, who is also the Principal of the neighbouring Leokeng Primary School says he's only the interim caretaker as the process to appoint a principal has begun.

# Food security a reality in Majakaneng

Johanna Kgeretse is one of the many Marikana residents who are building their own grassroots businesses to create new economic opportunities for themselves. Sibanye-Stillwater played a vital role in the growth of her backyard in Majakaneng, through the training and supply of protective crop tunnels for her home-based food garden.

The skills she gained in the MyBusiness course

growth of her business. The course is part of the Broad-based Livelihoods (BBL) programme, which is one of Sibanye-Stillwater's Marikana Renewal Programme initiatives. The BBL programme has been designed and implemented by partners Umsizi Sustainable Social Solutions and SocioTech. She started her garden in 2019 and has today reinvested the profits from her vegetable garden

to buy netting and materials, and expand her tunnel infrastructure, in turn increasing her crop production.

The livelihoods development programme empowers people to engage in productive economic activity using the resources they have, where they are – free from dependency on handouts. It trains people to effectively use garden farming to provide their

households with food and start their own enterprises. Johanna has now involved her family in her horticultural production and food preparation. For them, the programme has been lifechanging. She has been able to grow, prepare and sell diverse crops and food products right through winter, and the family is enjoying food security and a stable income. She is excited to continue producing and expanding.

Twenty SMMEs were selected as part of the Business Start Up Pitch and an additional ten selected by Bapo Ba Mogale Local Economic Development Trust.

# Faith-based leaders drive change in communities

### Baeteledipele ba sedumedi ba tlisa phetogo mo baaging

Sibanye-Stillwater together with faith-based leaders has been collaborating on social development programmes since 2020. The aim of the programme is to enable leaders to drive change in communities in and around its Rustenburg and Marikana operations.

In Marikana, community faith leaders, working with Umsizi Sustainable Social Solutions, were trained as "agents of change", and equipped to work with the people toward creating sustainable livelihoods at a community level.

The programme incorporates a Broad-based Livelihood food security programme aimed at enabling families to feed themselves through backyard gardens. To date, 800 participants have enrolled and 150 food tunnels in Segwaelane, Bapong, Moddersruit, Majakaneng and Thlapa villages in Rustenburg and Marikana area have been established.

The second collaboration entailed enlisting the participation of 75 faith-based leaders from the region where training has taken place on how to deal with the ongoing challenge of Gender-based Violence (GBV), as well as mental illness and issues of addiction.

Pastor James Motta, of the Bapong community, has immediately been able to put his new knowledge and skills into practice, working with rehabilitated inmates from local correctional services facilities. When recounting the training he has received, he states, "I found out I was far behind, but now I am so happy because this GBV training is very important."

The programme is also designed to work with the Broad-based Livelihoods (BBL) programme, which seeks to enable participants to become economically active.

# WiFi improves education

Sibanye-Stillwater has commenced with the rollout of WiFi to schools around its Marikana and Rustenburg operations. The pilot phase includes 12 schools in Marikana and 5 schools in Rustenburg.

The project will enable more than 11 000 learners to not only be able to access the internet but will also have access to Microsoft educational content, tailored to the South African school curriculum, for use by both educators and learners.


Internet connectivity has already brought about changes to learning and teaching practices. For instance, educators in different schools use the internet for lesson preparation, downloading past examination question papers, online tutoring, and research.

Internet access has improved the quality and enjoyment of education in many ways by helping learners to visualise what is being taught by the teachers in school. An example of this is how Moses Siko, a physical science teacher at Michael Modisakeng Secondary School, says he uses the WiFi to show learners simulations on YouTube.

Bapo Primary School Principal Godfrey Mashigo fully supports the use of information and communications technology (ICT) and the many benefits it brings to his school. He now uses WiFi to send school newsletters and other communication to parents, making it easier to keep parents informed and engaged. He would like to see Bapo Primary School transform into a smart school where technology improves learning and teaching.

Since it was implemented in July 2022, the project has seen a huge uptake. Between 18 July 2022 and 13 September 2022, 70 165 logins (sessions) have been recorded, using 5.7 Terabytes of data, and saving the users R1,1 million in data costs.

According to Project Isizwe, out of the approximately 23,471 public schools in South Africa, 16,897 do not have access to the internet for teaching and learning.

### **Managing our Tailings Storage Facilities**



Leaflets were handed out to the

Tailings, made up of post-processing mining waste material, may contain hazardous chemicals in minor concentrations that can be harmful to groundwater, livestock, vegetation and people.

This is why tailings are stored in safe permanent storage containment facilities also known as tailings dams. Sibanye-Stillwater is committed to applying industry best practices, protecting the environment, preventing harm to people and continuously monitoring its tailings storage facilities.

In the unlikely event of a tailings dam failure, Sibanye-Stillwater has emergency preparedness plans in

The plans are drafted in partnership with local authorities to mitigate harm to people, the environment and infrastructure.

#### Sibanye-Stillwater reduces tailings storage risks to communities by:

Fencing off and limiting access to the facility

- Installing lifesaving equipment such as lifebuoys around the dam to prevent drowning in the event of emergencies
- Installing signage to warn people not to enter, swim, drink the water, fish or consume alcohol around the dam
- Planting grass and other vegetation around the facility to reduce dust

#### How should the public behave around tailings storage facilities?

- The fences around the tailings facilities should not be damaged or broken to avoid harm to people and livestock
- For their safety, community members must not enter the tailings storage facility and return water dams area
- Swimming is not allowed as this may result in drowning or diseases
- The water stored in the facility may not be consumed by people or livestock because it may result in illness, disease, or even death
- Cattle are not allowed to graze on the facilities because the vegetation on the storage facility is used for dust control

### Tailings awareness sessions



Sibanye-Stillwater has renovated Sonop and Majakaneng Clinic, giving residents access to faster healthcare services. The renovation to Majakaneng includes an extension of the health facility which includes more consulting rooms, a staff kitchen, medical equipment, and furniture.

Operations Manager for the Mjakaneng Clinic, Sarah Sithole, says the renovation has been life-changing. "The highlight of this beautiful building is that it has enough space for us to do our work as healthcare workers. We can see more patients now. which has reduced the long

Before the much-needed renovation, the building was very small, with only a few consulting rooms available for staff. This often resulted in long waiting times for patients.

The Sonop Clinic building was old and didn't have enough space to meet the needs of the community. After extensive consultations on whether to

extend or refurbish the facility, a decision was made to renovate and use the existing space more efficiently.

The clinic now boasts a bigger building which includes consulting rooms, a pharmacy, a staff kitchen and essential

### **HARTIES DAM NEEDS YOU!**

Hartbeespoort - The National Sea Rescue Institute (NSI) was activated on Saturday 21 January 2023 to assist with evacuating passengers from a barge (a flat-bottomed inland waterway vessel). This occurred after the cruise barge became disabled when its motor propellers got stuck in old, discarded fishing nets and natural debris. Consequently, the barge was trapped by 1,2 to 1,4-metre-high hyacinths that surrounded the barge in natural drift. This has highlighted the issue of the green monster that has taken hold of the beloved dam and brought forward a possible solution as to how it could be saved.

With the propellors being disabled, the motors of the barge failed, and it was impossible to tow the stranded barge to shore because of the surrounding hyacinths. Fortunately, the NSRI rescue craft 'Sea Legs' and the SRU (Strategic Rescue Unit) rescue craft rescue 1 responded and were activated at 15:17.

Upon arrival at the barge, the rescue responders found that the captain and his nine crew members had ensured that all 72 passengers were secured into life jackets, were well hydrated and briefed on procedures to follow. With nine relays, all 72 passengers, the captain and nine barge crew members were transferred to the rescue craft and safely evacuated to shore from the barge despite the rescue operation being obstructed by the dense hyacinths that slowed progress.

There were no injuries, and the operation was completed at 17:30. An hour after the safety evacuation was completed the hyacinths had sufficiently separated from the barge which allowed the SRU craft rescue 1 (a large Gemini rigid hull inflatable boat) to tow the barge, negotiating the dense hyacinth, to shore without incident.

The high level of safety performed by the barge Captain and his nine crew members— who regularly receive NSRI safety training and NSRI safety advice—was noted as highly commendable. Although the safety of all persons involved comes as a relief, the state of the Hartbeespoort Dam should not be underrated as it has become a concern of safety and is deteriorating local businesses in the Hartbeespoort area that rely on the dam as a tourist attraction

In an interview with Jacaranda FM's Breakfast with Martin Bester on 23 January 2023, Rudy Joles, CEO of Harties Foundation, spoke about the growing hyacinth problem and a solution.

Joles stated the hyacinth problem has been afloat for more than 50 years, and that almost 900 hectares of the Hartbeespoort dam is currently covered with hyacinth. He also added that if nothing is done, the dam could be entirely covered by hyacinth by August this year. Hyacinth—more specifically 'water' hyacinth—is well known as the world's worst aquatic weed because of its highly invasive nature, negative impact on aquatic ecosystems, and the cost it takes to control it. "This is causing severe problems for investment, housing, jobs," said Joles, "no clubhouse can operate. It's affecting everyone and anyone that has anything to do in Harties.

On the bright side, Joles confirmed that The Harties Foundation was given permission by the government to solve the hyacinth issue by means of the Hartbeespoort Rehabilitation Project which aims to clear the dam in a sustainable and solution-driven manner. The project's plan of action is to physically go onto the dam with a vessel/boat and remove the hyacinth by hand.

"The solution is entirely doable and practical," said Joles, "the only thing standing in our way now is help and funding." For anyone who would like to help, please contact The Harties Foundation at 083 551 4969 or info@ hartiesfoundation.org.za.

The US National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID), Division of AIDS (DAIDS), Bethesda, Maryland, USA, and FHI Clinical SA (Pty) Ltd (situated at Design House, Ground Floor, 121 Amkor Road, Lyttelton Manor, Centurion, South Africa) as the sponsor's representative, will apply to the South African Health Products Regulatory Authority (SAHPRA), Department of Agriculture, Land Reform and Rural Development (DALRRD) and to the applicable Ethics Committees for permission to conduct a phase 2a clinical trial to evaluate the safety and immunogenicity of MTBVAC in adolescents and adults living with and without HIV in South Africa. The only licensed tuberculosis (TB) vaccine, BCG vaccine, is a live attenuated strain of Mycobacterium bovis (M.bovis) that was introduced in the clinical setting more than one hundred years ago. Vaccination with BCG is efficacious in preventing disseminated TB disease (miliary disease and tuberculous meningitis) in infants and recommended for routine immunization of healthy neonates in high incidence settings. It is not routinely administered to adults. Although more than 3 billion individuals have been immunized with BCG vaccine, with over 100 million doses administered annually, TB remains a leading infectious cause of global morbidity and mortality. In 2020, globally an estimated 10 million new cases of TB and 1.5 million TB-related deaths (including 214 000 deaths due to TB among HIV positive people) have been reported. TB continues to be a leading cause of respiratory death in children in sub-Saharan Africa. HIV is the leading risk factor for TB disease, and while antiretroviral therapy (ART) reduces TB morbidity and mortality, people living with HIV and AIDS have persistently high (greater than 4-fold) TB risk despite long-term ART and immune reconstitution. MTBVAC is a live rationally attenuated derivative of a human Mycobacterium tuberculosis (M.tb) isolate belonging to the Euro-American lineage, which contains all the genes present in M.tb strains, including the genes that are deleted in M.bovis and BCG. The main advantage of using rationally attenuated live M.tb as vaccine, is that many genes encoding important immunodominant antigens absent in BCG (and M.bovis), can still be expressed by attenuated M.tb, while the genetic deletions provide assurance for genetic stability of the engineered phenotype. These vaccines are expected to safely induce more specific and longer-lasting immune responses in humans that can provide protection against TB. The aim of this trial is to evaluate the safety and immunogenicity of MTBVAC vaccination in two new populations: adolescents and people living with HIV (PLWH). Additionally, the trial will evaluate BCG revaccination in adolescents and PLWH who previously received BCG vaccine in infancy to provide a better understanding of the safety and immunogenicity of BCG revaccination in these populations. BCG is not frequently used in this population, and data are lacking on the immunogenicity of BCG in PLWH. Additionally, BCG revaccination is being considered as a preventative strategy in a variety of populations, including adolescents. It therefore will be useful to compare the immunogenicity of MTBVAC to BCG. In this trial, approximately 276 volunteers aged 12 through 55 years living with or without HIV, and with and without T-cell memory to M.tb will be enrolled. Each participant will receive a single intradermal injection of the assigned study product and will be followed for 48 weeks. The estimated study duration is 18 months, and participation duration on the clinical trial is 12 months of scheduled clinic visits per participant. The primary objectives of the trial are to evaluate the safety of MTBVAC vaccination by HIV status through study Week 48 and to evaluate the cellular immunogenicity of MTBVAC vaccination by HIV and interferon-gamma release assay (IGRA) status through study Week 10.



A reputable courier service will be used to transport clinical research products to South Africa in cartons, by airfreight following the appropriate storage requirements. The products will be supplied in sealed containers and transported in shippers that meet international legal requirements for transport by air and road. Southern Trials - ICRPMC works under contract to DAIDS/NIAID/US National Institutes of Health (NIH), and is licensed with SAHPRA to store and distribute clinical research products. The ICRPMC will receive products on behalf of the Principal Investigators and distribute them to the clinical research sites for the duration of the study. The study sites will follow stringent procedures regarding the disposal of used syringes as biohazardous waste. Upon completion of the trial, any remaining study vaccine vials will be destroyed at sites. All local requirements for destruction of biohazardous material will be followed. 




