Fire causes more than R100 million damage

Koster - Eagles Pride Hatchery (Pty) Ltd (Eagles Pride Hatchery) is part of the Kuipers Group (Pty) Ltd (Kuipers Group) which mainly operates in the poultry industry (commercial eggs, broiler, and poultry feed). Eagles Pride Hatchery operates mainly in the broiler poultry division of Kuipers approximately 7 km from Koster on the R509 towards Swartruggens.

On Saturday 29 July 2023, at around 06:30 am the security at the Eagles Pride Hatchery Koster operation noticed smoke coming from one of two hatcheries at the facility. The security immediately informed the management of the hatchery. This occurred during at time at which staff were coming on duty. Upon investigation, it was noticed that a fire was burning in the hatchery and all employees were immediately evacuated from both hatcheries. According to Kuipers Group chief executive officer Charles Le Maitré the exact cause and origin of the fire has not yet been determined. At this stage, it is believed that an electrical shortage might have caused the fire.

management team contacted Kgetlengriver Local Municipality (KLM) to request the fire department to assist with the fire. The management were told that all the fire trucks were sent in for service and were not operational. This fire department could therefore not assist. KLM phoned back and informed management that had

requested the Rustenburg Local Municipality's (RLM) fire department to assist with the fire. It is unknown to us as to why all fire trucks were sent in for service and were not operational, especially during winter months with increased fire hazards. KLM is less than a 10 minutes' drive from the Group. Eagles Pride Hatchery have various Eagles Pride Hatchery near Koster, and we hatcheries, including one which is situated believe that if they could have responded, the damage to property would have been minimum. With the quick thinking of management and employees on site, the building link between the two hatcheries and office block were demolished to prevent the fire from spreading further to the second hatchery. When the fire started, it was posted on all emergency WhatsApp groups in the area, including Rustenburg, Lindleyspoort and Swartruggens. The first responders attending to the fire were the Koster Eagles Pride Hatchery employees who formed part of trained firefighting teams. Additional firefighting equipment and manpower was also dispatched from other Eagles Pride Hatcheries and Kuipers Group facilities. The Rustenburg Fire Department arrived at around 08:30 on the scene, but by this time most of the damage was already done and the fire had almost burnt out. They left the scene around 14:00 after they were satisfied that the fire was fully extinguished and posed no further threat. The Rustenburg Fire Department was extremely professional, and their assistance was greatly appreciated by all. We are extremely grateful and



humble to our employees, neighbours, farmers in and will need to be demolished in total. 

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

Rustenburg - On Friday 28 July a lady who works at a business near the corner of Brink and Klopper Street witnessed a couple of men who were in possession of a Yorkie. The ladv noticed that the dog was being treated poorly and took the dog from the men. The lady then took the dog to a nearby veterinarian to check whether it was chipped to determine ownership. Upon her return, the men started harassing her as they demanded money for the dog. The harassment continued throughout the day at her workspace, and escalated to the point where she could not enter her vehicle at the time of going home. The matter was reported to a local CPF group, and a female CPF member responded to help the lady. 

KEY INITIATIVES FOR 2023/24

Provincial Treasury in collaboration with National Treasury will enhance the Infrastructure Reporting Model through the rollout of the Infrastructure Delivery Management System (IDMS) Helpdesk to all provincial infrastructure departments.

Through the Office of the Provincial Accountant General, we shall continue to provide financial management oversight and support to all departments and public entities on accounting, audit, risk management, reviewing of financial statements and monitoring of the post audit action plans for improved audit outcomes.

With regard to Provincial Internal Audit, focused audit work will again be performed on the adequacy and effectiveness of risk management and post audit action plan systems. These two (2) systems remain central for the improvement in service delivery and clean administration in the Province. Provincial Internal Audit will also perform assessments of combined assurance systems.

In our quest to empower Provincial Departments and their Entities with the implementation of the new Preferential Procurement Regulation (PPR 22), Provincial Treasury is embarking on intensive training of all Bid Committees (both Provincial Departments and their Entities). The training program will be rolled out in the beginning of the second quarter of 2023/2024 financial year.

In recognition of our young people being at the core of our developmental agenda, the department will be hosting a Youth Summit for learners from rural areas across the province to educate and expose them to career opportunities available in the finance and commerce sectors.

PROVINCIAL SOCIO-ECONOMIC OUTLOOK

The Province is experiencing sluggish growth and high unemployment. The provincial GDP growth has averaged 1.0 per cent for the years from 2018 to 2021 which is a far cry from the 6.0 per cent growth targeted by the National Development Plan (NDP).

DEPARTMENTAL OWN REVENUE

One of the critical functions of the Department is to ensure equitable distribution and allocation of resources to departments in line with national and provincial fiscal policy plans. The Provincial Treasury contribution towards provincial own revenue target of R1.2 billion for 2023, is R195 million.

REFLECTIONS ON THE 2022/23 FINANCIAL YEAR

The Provincial Executive Representatives (PER's) and Provincial Municipal Financial Recovery Services (MFRS) teams have been deployed to municipalities to assist with the implementation of Interim Rescue Plans and development of the Financial Recovery Plans.

BUDGET VOTE AND POLICY SPEECH

KAOBITSA BUSHY MAAPE North West Premier Kaobitsa Bushy Maape tabled the 2023/24 Office of the Premier Budget Vote and Policy Speech before the North West Provincial Legislature on Thursday, 01 June 2023 where he reflected on achievements recorded in the previous financial year and plans to strengthen state capacity in the current financial year.

PROCUREMENT AND SUPPORT TO LOCAL BUSINESSES

The Office of the Premier has approved an internal Preferential Procurement Policy that guides strategic sourcing during the year under review. We understand the importance of supporting small and emerging businesses in our communities and are committed to creating equal economic opportunities for all. We remain committed to procurement expenditure spending on set targets for women, youth, and people with disabilities.

WOMEN, YOUTH AND PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

For the current financial year, the Office of the Premier will increase spending on Women, Youth and People with Disabilities to an amount of R29.6 million, which is more than the threshold of 25% of the designated groups. We will also continue to pay special attention to the socio-economic conditions of military veterans, older persons, and liberation struggle stalwarts.

ADDRESSING YOUTH DEVELOPMENT AND SKILLS

During the month of June, the Office will lead major initiatives working with various SETAs to fund critical skills development initiatives by the province. We are in discussions with MERSETA to fund training of youth in the installation of solar panels. We will further use the SETAs to train engineers for local municipalities. We are targeting at least more

than 3000 young people for these programmes. In addition, some of these initiatives will include funding student bursaries and assistance to some students with payment of outstanding debts.

STRENGTHENING THE CAPACITY OF THE STATE

In an effort to promote policy coherence and integrated planning across government, the Office of the Premier will continue to assess the Annual Performance Plans of Departments to ensure they are aligned and responsive to service delivery needs of our people. Departments have also been directed to reduce current vacancy rate in the provincial administration including other state entities, by filling posts required for service delivery and opening entry level positions for unemployed graduates.

FIGHT AGAINST CORRUPTION & STRENGTHENING ACCOUNTABILITY

We have designed a Provincial Geographic Information system (web-based application) which is triggered by the District Development Model approach, as it will be able to collect and store demographic and district profiles. Communities of the province will be able to raise and report service delivery challenges through this web application. This work will be linked to our commitment to establish a command centre to monitor service delivery challenges.

As the provincial government we want to embed our anti-corruption strategy and campaigns in communities in order to build a critical mass of stakeholders who will work with government to rid our province of this cancer of corruption. Office of the Premier will initiate a series of consultation meetings with the Traditional Leadership, the mining sector, faith-based organisations, and government departments to participate in the implementation of the strategy in this financial year 2023/24.

SUPPORT TO OUR MUNICIPALITIES

We have refined and revised a performance reporting tool which will be used to monitor and measure the performance of municipalities. The Premier has established an oversight committee comprising of the MECs of COGHSTA and Provincial Treasury, which meet regularly with the Auditor General to discuss post audit plans of municipalities.

WATER PROVISION PLANS

In our quest to address the water challenges in the province, we have established the provincial steering committee co-chaired by the Premier and the Minister of Water and Sanitation. The steering committee has finalised a provincial plan to address water challenges in the following identified "water hotspots areas", which are Ditsobotla, Tswaing, Ramotshere Moiloa, Naledi, Mamusa, Maquasi Hills and City of Matlosana

Local Municipalities. We will soon be launching operation "Bulela Metsi" in these

IMPROVING CONNECTIVITY AND ICT GOVERNANCE

Office of the Premier has started the network modernisation programme in collaboration with the Department of Arts, Culture, Sports and Recreation (ACSR). The programme is intended to provide internet services to onehundred and twenty-three (123) libraries across the province, allowing communities to access the internet in the libraries.

IMPROVING COMMUNICATING THE WORK OF GOVERNMENT

We are improving our communications to keep our communities informed about the work of government. For this financial year, the Executive Council supported by the Office of the Premier will hold regular media briefings to inform the public on EXCO decisions on various programmes and projects.

MORAL REGENERATION AND SOCIAL COHESION

We plan to convene District Moral Regeneration festivals across all the four Districts with focus on fighting teenage pregnancy, gangsterism, drug and substance abuse as well as gender-based violence and femicide. We will also strengthen our partnership with religious formations and where practical have joint developmental programmes.

Early warning systems in case of tailings storage facilities emergencies



Early warning of an emergency can prevent it from escalating into a disaster that will cost lives, destroy infrastructure, and damage the environment.

Therefore, Sibanye-Stillwater has installed warning sirens in strategic places within the community where it can be audible to all affected community members, should an emergency arise, and evacuation is required.

In case of a tailings dam emergency, assembly points have been identified within the community by our Engineers of Record analysis where it will be safe to gather.

NOTE: The details of the assembly points will be shared in due course.

THE SIREN SOUND:

For a tailings dam emergency, an alarm will be heard within the community with alternating sounds (7 second on and 7 second off)

What to do when you hear the sound of the evacuation siren?

- Try to stay calm
- Stop what you are doing
- Start walking quickly and calmy to the closest assembly point (as identified by Sibanve-Stillwater)
- Assist any person, but only if safe to do so • Once you arrive at the community
- assembly point wait for further instructions from the Disaster Management personnel

What should you NOT do if you hear the evacuation siren sound?

- · Do not ignore the siren
- Do not panic
- Do not run
- Do not stop to take videos or photos
- Do not return to your home to collect personal belongings
- Do not push once at the assembly





Rustenburg – Strong winds, a characteristic feature of the month of August, can cause destruction when they pick up embers which go on to cause fires.

We reached out to Debbie Snyman, Great Rustenburg Fire Protection Association chairperson, who shared the following information: In August, the strongest factor is wind. Fires need ignition, oxygen, and fuel (vegetative matter). In rural areas, careless actions like dropped cigarettes or unextinguished warming and cooking fires can lead to major fires, especially with the August winds' influence.

Fire breaks can slow down fires, and landowners should have these in place by now. No burning of breaks is allowed this time in the season, but landowners can continue to make breaks by slashing, ploughing, and scraping an area free of

combustible vegetation.

Create a defendable space around homes and structures, keeping firefighting equipment on hand as required by law. Clear areas around cooking fires to prevent sparks from igniting vegetation. No open flames are allowed except in specially designed fire-safe areas.

Stay vigilant, day and night, monitor the wind, and collaborate with neighbours for fire safety.
