of instinct and bait that led a lioness back to safety after her brief escape from Lost Valley Predators on Rex Road. On Wednesday evening, 5 June 2024, the young lioness, named Savanna, returned unharmed to her enclosure

Shortly after Savanna's escape on Monday afternoon, notices circulated on social media in which the public was advised not to approach the lioness, avoid sudden movements, and slowly back away if they encountered her. The community readily complied with these guidelines.

Savanna, though raised with human care and described as very tame, remains a wild animal capable of instinctive reactions when threatened. At the time of her escape, she was in heat, which may have influenced

Local residents were highly vigilant, opting to stay indoors to avoid any possible encounters with the lioness. Even pets were kept inside, away from both the lioness and the cold weather.

Jonathan Denga, North West Provincial Director for Biodiversity Management and

said the gate of the camp where the lioness was kept was opened for a few seconds, and she made use of the opportunity to escape. By Wednesday morning, Savanna's movements were noted. "It was evident that the lioness came close to the trap cage that was set for her," Denga said.

After making a brief detour near the Dinnie Estates, she returned to her familiar territory. Baabua Thukubi, Deputy Director of External Communications for the Department of Economic Development, Environment, Conservation, and Tourism, confirmed that the lioness was successfully lured into the trap cage set near Lost Valley by early Wednesday evening, shortly after 6 o'clock.

The successful recapture of Savanna was the result of a coordinated effort between Problem Animal Control Specialist officials and the owners of Lost Valley. Their teamwork ensured the lioness's safe return, much to the relief of the local community.

SWIFT POLICE ACTION LEADS TO ARRESTS

Rustenburg/ Ventersdorp – A multi-disciplinary team consisting of North West Provincial Crime Intelligence, Rustenburg Crime Intelligence, Rustenburg Public Order Police (POP), and the Rustenburg Flying Squad intercepted a Mercedes Benz vehicle and arrested two suspects following a business robbery in Ventersdorp on Friday 31 May 2024.

Lieutenant colonel Amanda Funani reported that three armed men entered and robbed a store of jewellery and clothes in Ventersdorp. They were seen a few minutes later fleeing the scene in a white Mercedes Benz.

Rustenburg Police were promptly informed and instructed to be on the lookout for the vehicle, which was spotted in the Rustenburg Central Business District (CBD). During the interception in Bo-Dorp, one of the suspects managed to flee with some of the stolen jewellery. However, the police successfully searched the vehicle, finding a 9mm firearm, ammunition, and clothing stolen from the store. Additionally, it was discovered that the Mercedes Benz had been stolen in Pretoria in June 2023.

The two apprehended suspects, aged 30 and 33, were arrested for business robbery, possession of suspected stolen property, and unlawful possession of firearms and ammunition. A manhunt has been launched for the third

Glencore Mine back in operation after four weeks



Rustenburg/ Bethanie - The Glencore Rhovan mine operations, situated in Bethanie village in the Rustenburg Local Municipality, is back in operation after four weeks of work stoppage. This after local residents blockaded roads, complaining about lack of employment opportunities by the contractors' doing business at the mine. The mine workforce comprises 65% of the local community members.

After three weeks of negotiation between the provincial government, Rhovan Glencore mine and community leaders, agreed on short, medium, and long term solutions, with employment of fixed term workers being an immediate measure. Seventy workers will be employed immediately and another batch of seventy will be employed in July for a minimum of six months, in different projects including the establishment of a solar power

"We are delighted to announce that the community has agreed to opportunities presented to them by the mine as a short-term measure. We will resolve other issues raised which included the businesses after creating legitimate structures in the areas," said MEC for Economic Development, Environment, Conservation and Tourism (DEDECT) Virginia Tlhapi.

"We intend to host community meetings in all Bakwena ba Mogopa villages to form structures that will champion the interest of the communities. The provincial government also intends to oversee the formation of the Board of Trustees as soon as possible, which will be accountable to the mine royalties of Bakwena Ba Mogopa and further create socio-economic opportunities for all," MEC Tlhapi added.

Glencore's chief operation officer, Adriaan Brugman said the Rhovan remains committed to empowering their host communities so that they thrive with good education, better health facilities and with business and employment opportunities.

"We have employed 649 workers and 65% are from the Bakwena Ba Mogopa villages and we have about 380 on fixed term contracts of which 86% are locals. All employment and business opportunities are advertised on our information portal to ensure fairness and transparency. We are creating other opportunities through the implementation of the social and labour plans. The current SLP is vet to be approved. This is worrisome because we want to implement projects and unlock more opportunities," said Brugman.

Through Glencore's SLP projects, the mine has amongst others built the Bethanie Clinic, Barseba, Makolokwe and Bethanie Sports Facility, built ablution facilities at the local schools and has entered into a MoU with Magalies Water and Rustenburg Local Municipality to supply bulk water to local community members.

The mine is also skilling local community members for employment opportunities and to be business-ready. The mine also empowers locals through training and development interventions including bursaries. learnerships, scholarships, internships, and business studies through GIBS.

SPIKE IN VEHICLE THEFT

Rustenburg - The Rustenburg community is facing a significant surge in vehicle theft, particularly targeting specific makes and models.

The South African Police Service (SAPS) has issued a stern warning to residents to be vigilant and take proactive measures to protect their vehicles. According to SAPS communications officer sergeant Ofentse Mokgadi, there has been a noticeable increase in the theft of Toyota Hilux, Fortuner, Quantum, VW Polo, NP 200, and Ford Ranger vehicles in and around Rustenburg. Sergeant Mokgadi advises, "People should be extra careful with their vehicles. If possible, fit in a tracking device or any other security system.' He highlighted that known hotspots for these thefts include mines, residential areas, shopping malls, and school parking lots during events.

Sergeant Mokgadi also emphasised the importance of community involvement in tackling this issue. "We really appreciate the Community Police Forum (CPF) contribution in assisting us in fighting crime, as well as other security companies. To report on the matter, please phone your nearest police station or seek help from various security WhatsApp groups.'

Community Police Forum Exco acting chairperson, Marcus Haasbroek, echoed these concerns. "We have had an excessive increase in vehicle theft." especially at school events where the vehicles are parked outside. Shopping centres are also just as problematic," Haasbroek stated. He advised vehicle owners to install gear locks, foot pedal locks, and tracking devices to make their vehicles harder targets for thieves. "Always make sure your vehicle is properly secured and avoid parking in low light, low foot traffic areas," he added.

Morné Engelbrecht, general manager of Arena Outdoor Security, pointed out that Toyota Hilux bakkies, including single cab, extended cab, and double cab models, are particularly sought after by thieves. "There is a market – especially for white vehicles. It is about what the syndicates are interested in and want. There are tons of Toyotas and Volkswagens on the road every day. They are popular and efficient," Engelbrecht explained. He recommended installing a tracker or upgrading security but warned that these measures alone might not deter determined thieves. "A hotspot is any place where your vehicle is not locked. In Rustenburg, it would be shopping centres, malls, mines, and sporting events. It takes thieves literally 3 to 5 minutes to steal a car and get away with it," he noted.

Engelbrecht's tip for the community is simple: "Always stay cautious." For further assistance, Arena Outdoor Security can be contacted at 082 657 8577. The SAPS urges all members of the Rustenburg community to contact them if they see any suspicious persons around vehicles during events. Reports can be made by calling 0860 10111, 10111, or 112 from a cell phone. Your vigilance and prompt reporting can help curb this alarming trend and protect the community from further vehicle thefts.

MOGWASE COURT HANDS DOWN 15-YEAR SENTENCE FOR MURDER

Mogwase - On Monday 27 May 2024, the Mogwase Regional Court sentenced 24-year-old Moeti Sefale to fifteen years of direct imprisonment for the murder of Reitumetse Gladys Pitso in July 2022. The tragic incident occurred in Monono village

During the trial, the court heard that on the day of the murder, Sefale assaulted Pitso, his girlfriend at the time, with a spade, leading to her death. It was alleged that Sefale found Pitso in bed with another man and, in a fit of rage, attacked both individuals. The man managed to escape, but Pitso was not as fortunate. Detective sergeant Tshepang Mataboge was

assigned to the case, successfully tracing and arresting Sefale. Bojanala Platinum Sub-District 2 commissioner, brigadier Mamotsamai Ntoagae, along with her management team, welcomed the sentencing of Sefale. Brigadier Ntoagae extended her gratitude to sergeant Mataboge and all stakeholders involved in the case.

In addition to the murder charge, Sefale, a Lesotho national, was sentenced to three months for illegal immigration and declared unfit to possess a firearm. He had been denied bail since his arrest, with Detective Mataboge successfully opposing his bail applications.

Zinniaville residents still grapple with persistent stench: is there a solution in sight?



Rustenburg/ Boitekong - In an unusual incident, an Independent Electoral Commission (IEC) tent was stolen between Tuesday, 28 May and Wednesday, 29 May 2024, near Jabula Mine. The theft has raised concerns within the community, but it did not deter the ongoing voting process. Brigadier Sabata Mokgwabone reported, "A case has been opened at the Boitekong Police Station. Unfortunately, the tent has not been recovered yet." Despite the setback, the IEC promptly erected another tent later that day, ensuring that the voting continued.

Authorities urge anyone with information regarding the stolen tent to contact the South African Police Services (SAPS) on 08600 10111.

Rustenburg/ Zinniaville - The community of Zinniaville continues to endure a persistent stench originating from the daily operations of the Rainbow Chicken-Epol complex, despite numerous articles and public complaints dating back to April 2021. The offensive odour remains a daily struggle for residents, raising concerns about the efficacy of measures taken to address this issue and prompting calls for a definitive

Since the problem was first highlighted in 2021, RCL Foods, the parent company of Rainbow Chicken, has engaged with the Rustenburg Local Municipality multiple times. Despite these efforts, the stench lingers, casting doubt on the effectiveness of the ongoing discussions and remedial actions.

In April 2021, a meeting involving the environmental manager of the Rustenburg Local Municipality, the Zinniaville Ratepayers Association, RCL Foods, and the Bojanala Local Municipality was held. The agenda included discussions on the Waste to Value Plant, water provision, and the pending air pollution license.

However, after three years, the problem remains unresolved. Platinum Weekly has reached out repeatedly to the Rustenburg Local Municipality, RCL Foods, and the Zinniaville Ratepayers Association for updates since March

2024, yet limited feedback has been received.

The residents of Zinniaville concrete await а resolution to this longstanding issue. As the stench continues to disrupt daily life, the community's frustration grows. The guestion remains: when will the responsible parties take decisive action to end this nuisance once and for all?
