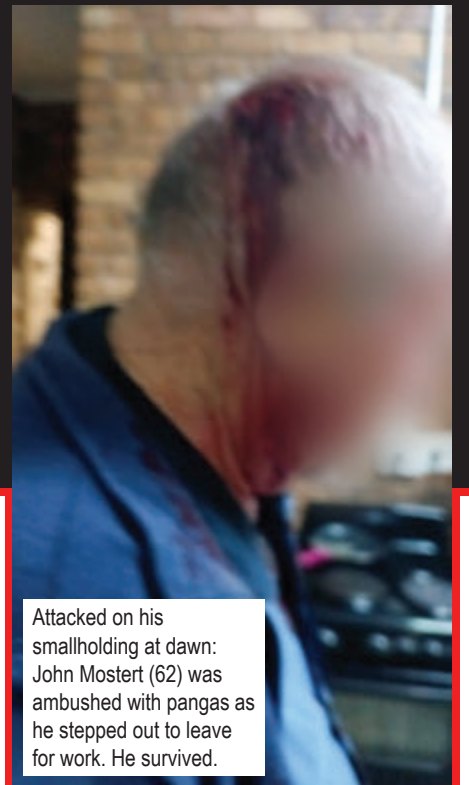

HORROR on Mooiinooi Smallholding

Attacked on his smallholding at dawn: John Mostert (62) was ambushed with pangas as he stepped out to leave for work. He survived.

Mooiinooi/ Elandsdrift – On Friday 1 August 2025 just after sunrise, John Mostert (62) stepped out of his home on his smallholding in Elandsdrift (just outside Mooiinooi) — and into a nightmare.

It was just before 6am when unknown assailants attacked him with pangas as he was about to get into his car and leave for work. They overpowered him, hacking at him with machetes. The only thing they stole was his wallet.

Mostert, bloodied but conscious, fought them off and got help. He was taken to hospital and is currently recovering. A case of robbery with a weapon has been opened. The suspects fled the scene on foot. No arrests have been made.

They strike when you're most vulnerable

Was it random? Was he followed? We don't know. But what we do know is this: criminals are out there. Watching. Waiting. Hunting for the next soft moment — when you unlock your gate, walk to your car, or turn your back for a second. If you live on a farm, smallholding or in a rural area, stay vigilant. Make your routine unpredictable. Install outdoor lighting, motion sensors, alarms — anything to buy you time.

Do you know something about this?

DELAYED AGAIN

Caroline Werner murder trial faces another setback

Rustenburg — Justice for Caroline Werner remains painfully out of reach. On Thursday, 31 July 2025, the Rustenburg Regional Court once again postponed the long-running murder trial of Solly “Moya” Molefe (22), the man accused of taking the life of 31-year-old Caroline Werner in September 2022. According to the National Prosecuting Authority (NPA), the matter has been postponed to 25 August 2025 for the continuation of the trial. But for Caroline’s family, the official explanation adds insult to injury. “This time, they said it was because the drains were blocked,” Caroline’s mother told *Platinum Weekly*, her voice heavy with frustration and grief. “We keep going back, hoping it’s finally time. And every time, we leave with the same heartache.” This follows yet another in a string of delays — just a day earlier, on 30 July, the hearing was called off due to a power failure that left the court without electricity. Prior postponements were caused by missing dockets, absent witnesses, and other administrative hurdles. Caroline was found murdered near the R24 and Dinie Estates Road almost three years ago. “Each delay feels like reopening the wound,” her mother said. “We want answers. We want justice. We want peace.”

In loving memory of Caroline Werner – a vibrant, joyful soul whose absence leaves an ache in every heart that knew her. Forever missed, never forgotten.



Murder in Tuin Street flat: boyfriend on the run

Rustenburg — The body of a woman was discovered in a flat in Tuin Street on Monday evening, 4 August 2025. The South African Police Service (SAPS) has since launched a manhunt for the suspect — believed to be the woman’s boyfriend — who allegedly confessed to the killing before fleeing the scene. According to SAPS spokesperson sergeant Ofentse Mokgadi, police were alerted just after 17:00 by the caretaker of the building and a friend of the suspect. When police entered the flat, they found the woman’s lifeless body with three stab wounds to her neck. The friend reportedly received a disturbing phone call from the suspect earlier that day, in which he admitted to stabbing his girlfriend during a fight the previous night, Sunday, 3 August. The suspect remains on the run. Brigadier Mamotsamai Ntoagae, acting district commissioner of Bojanala Platinum Sub-District 2, has condemned the brutal killing. A case of murder has been opened. SAPS urges anyone with information that could assist the investigation to contact captain Elizabeth Tieties on 082 772 9468 or visit the Rustenburg Police Station.

Out of the Cage, Into the Claws of the State?

SA'S LION BREEDING BAN SETS ROARWORTHY DEBATE

SA – In a highly controversial development, minister Dr Dion George has moved to outlaw new captive lion breeding facilities in South Africa. This latest phase of the lion industry has once again stirred strong reactions, warnings, and sharp public debate.

What's New: The Lion Prohibition Notice

- On 15 July 2025, Dr George announced the imminent publication of a Lion Prohibition Notice, aimed at banning the establishment of new captive-breeding facilities.
- This follows recommendations from the Ministerial Task Team and aligns with updated Threatened or Protected Species (TOPS) Regulations under NEM:BA.
- The Notice has already passed the 30-day parliamentary window and is awaiting executive approval.
- Provincial MECs are now being engaged to facilitate implementation, with the minister planning further stakeholder announcements at upcoming forums like the G20 climate meeting in Kruger National Park.

Voices from Both Sides

Those defending the captivebreeding industry warn the ban will backfire: "If you ban this, lions will become extinct" is a refrain often heard — though widely debunked by others. Critics explain that captive lions bred for tourism or trophy hunting are separate from wild populations and do not contribute to wildlion conservation.

Economic arguments are also prominent: Hannes Wessels, of the Predator Breeder's Association, asserts the industry supports 8,000 jobs and supplies crucial rural income. He warns that closing the industry with no transition plan could devastate local economies.

Meanwhile, animal welfare and conservation groups strongly favour the ban: World Animal Protection points to 8,000–12,000 captive lions across more than 300 facilities, many confined for canned hunts or used in the lionbone trade, posing serious welfare and conservation risks.

Context & Why It Matters

Earlier pledges dating back to 2021 promised to phase out the captive lion industry, but critics say enforcement has lagged. As of today, South Africa holds the world's largest captive-bred lion population.

The Bottom Line

South Africa's proposed ban is a watershed moment in its longrunning lionbreeding debate. Conservationists see it as overdue and essential; breeders fear job losses and unintended consequences for wild populations. Earlier fears — like lions going extinct — have been widely refuted... and does seem plausible. But the tension between welfare, economy, and biodiversity remains raw.

A critic wrote: "Lions don't need a new form of captivity — just under a different name. With state-run facilities often underfunded and poorly managed, some believe that lions could suffer more under official care than in private facilities." Trusting government to care for thousands of lions long-term, critics argue, is a gamble South Africa may not be ready to win.

The only certainty? The roaring national conversation is far from over.

Building a Future of Care, Not Crisis

Rustenburg – In a powerful show of unity and purpose, Minerals Council South Africa, in partnership with Sibanye-Stillwater and Glencore Alloys, hosted a transformative Thuthuzela Care Centres (TCC) Day of Learning — bringing together key stakeholders to strengthen the country's response to gender-based violence and femicide (GBVF).

Held despite the challenges of a power outage, the event sparked meaningful dialogue and renewed commitment to building integrated, survivor-centred systems of care.

The gathering brought together voices from government, the private sector, and civil society. Together, they explored how community-based

organisations (CBOs), private companies, and Thuthuzela Care Centres can work as a unified force to offer not just emergency support — but long-term, community-anchored healing.

"CBOs are uniquely positioned to complement the work of Thuthuzela Care Centres — offering pre- and post-referral support, driving awareness campaigns, following up with survivors, and remaining a steadfast local presence long after cases are closed," said Zanele Ngwepe, head of finance and operations at the GBVF Response Fund. "Let us build a future where survivors are met not with silence, but with solidarity. Where CBOs are not scraping to survive but are resourced to lead. And where the private sector becomes a visible and

vocal ally in dismantling the root causes of GBVF." The programme included the launch of the TCC National Partnership 2024 Report, which highlighted key milestones, lessons learned, and strategies moving forward. A standout message from the day: "Nothing worth having comes easy. But when it's done, it makes all the difference." Participants also visited the TCC facility at JST Hospital, experiencing first-hand the space where healing and justice intersect. One of the most exciting developments was the joint support expressed for the establishment of a new TCC in Moses Kotane. Minerals Council South Africa will spearhead the coordination of stakeholder involvement to bring this vital service to life.

Rustenburg – From bush cutting to road sign repainting, from clothing donations to storm drain clearing — Our Ward Matters (OWM) continues to make a visible and heartfelt impact across Rustenburg. Led by André van Dyk and Cllr Tanya Rothman, the initiative now proudly serves not one, but two wards: Ward 17 and Ward 16 (Geelhoutpark). And every week, their efforts remind us that a little teamwork goes a long way in building a better, safer, and cleaner community. The team rolled up their sleeves on Thursday 31 July 2025 and got to work at the top of Krokodilrivier, trimming back thick bush, removing overgrown grass from the road edges, and collecting litter. And a very special thank you goes to Outdoor Arena Security for being present, patrolling the area and protecting the OWM team and their equipment during these operations.

Early on Monday morning, 4 August, two OWM members were dropped off in Palalarivier to begin clearing overgrown grass and rubbish in the veld. One team member even walked all the way from Selly Park to Waterfall Mall, picking up litter along the R24.

during RLM electricity crackdown

Rustenburg – A Rustenburg Local Municipality (RLM) electrical unit bakkie was set alight during a disconnection drive targeting illegal electricity connections in Karlien Park on Friday 1 August 2025.

Impala crushes Matlosana

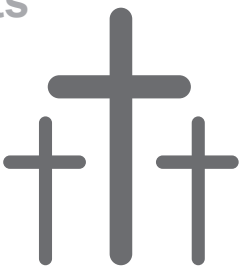

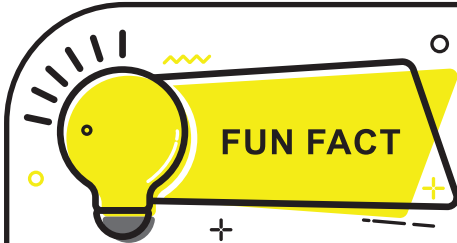

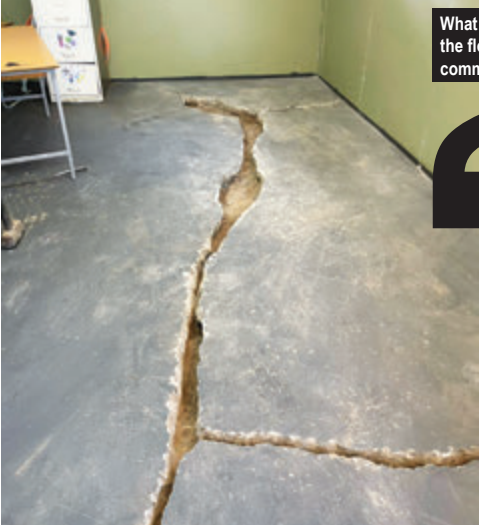

Rustenburg – The Rustenburg Mall recently partnered with local businesses to support Rustenburg Buitengewone Onderwys, a school that provides specialised education for 149 children living with physical, intellectual, and developmental challenges. "This wasn't just about paint and plumbing — it was about dignity," said Annereen Taylor, general manager of Rustenburg Mall. "Every child deserves a clean, safe, and beautiful environment in which to learn and grow." The transformation was met with heartfelt gratitude from the learners and staff, whose smiles and

words of thanks underscored the impact of the upgrades. The initiative served as a reminder that even small improvements can bring about meaningful change — especially when driven by a community that cares. By standing together to support a local school that plays such a vital role, Rustenburg Mall and its partners demonstrated the power of unity, empathy, and action — leaving behind more than repaired walls. They left behind renewed hope, pride, and a strengthened sense of community.
